SUMMARY/DISCUSSION:

It may be necessary on occasion for Natividad Medical Center to transfer a patient to Santa Clara Valley Medical Center for outpatient or inpatient healthcare services that are not provided or available at NMC.

The parties desire to enter into this Agreement in order to arrange for the orderly, timely and therapeutically beneficial transfer of patients and to establish the conditions under which transfers occur. This agreement is a patient transfer agreement whereby the terms and conditions regarding the transfer are mutually agreed upon in advance of the transfer.

The current five-year transfer agreement expires June 30, 2018. The County of Santa Clara requires a new agreement be executed in lieu of extending the Agreement for an additional term. The indemnification provision in which Monterey County, as the transferring hospital, and insurance provisions in the proposed agreement are identical to the same provisions in the current agreement.

OTHER AGENCY INVOLVEMENT:

County Counsel has reviewed and approved this Agreement as to legal form. The Auditor-Controller has reviewed and approved as to the limited payment provisions. The Agreement has also

been reviewed and approved by NMC's Finance Committee on April 26, 2018 and by its Board of Trustees on May 4, 2018.

FINANCING:

Costs associated with the Agreement are minimal. In some circumstances Medicare/Medi-Cal will require NMC to pay for some services and include them in NMC's facility claim to Medicare/Medi-Cal.

SUMMARY/DISCUSSION:

In 2014, Centers for Medicare and Medicaid Services (CMS) established a program to promote the use of appropriate use criteria (AUC) for advanced diagnostic imaging services. The AUC are defined as criteria that are evidenced-based and assist professionals who order imaging services to make the most appropriate treatment decisions for a specific clinical condition. CMS has mandated that the AUC be implemented by January 2020 for any facility that will bill Medicare for reimbursement.

The National Decision Support Company will be providing software that connects with NMC electronic medical record and ordering system for the diagnostic imaging department. The software provides the required evidence based criteria defined in the CMS mandate.

The National Decision Support Company is the only vendor able to supply the required AUC for a Meditech based platform.

OTHER AGENCY INVOLVEMENT:

County Counsel has reviewed and approved this agreement as to legal form, and the Auditor-Controller has reviewed and approved as to payment provisions. The agreement has also been reviewed and approved by NMC's Finance Committee on April 26, 2018 and by its Board of Trustees on May 6, 2018.

FINANCING:

The cost for this agreement is \$114,500 of which \$30,900 is included in the Fiscal Year 2017-18 Adopted Budget. Amounts for remaining years of the agreement will be included in those budgets as appropriate. There is no impact to the General Fund.

SUMMARY/DISCUSSION:

Creekbridge Apartments at 1757 Independence Boulevard, Unit 204:

The visiting student and resident program at NMC has existed for over twenty years. Learning resources and administrative support are offered up to four students or residents for two to six week periods throughout the year. NMC uses the apartment for visiting students from several medical schools and residencies; offering housing is an important incentive for visiting students, who are more likely to apply and match to NMC's Family Medicine Residency after rotating here. Housing must be located within a reasonable distance from the hospital. Since August, 2005, Creekbridge Apartments has provided access, proximity, and cost effectiveness.

UCSF currently reimburses NMC \$30,000 a year for support of medical student training that is used for leasing a medical student apartment at Creekbridge Apartments. This allows medical students to use NMC for clinical rotations, and allows NMC to continue this important relationship. It is important because of the UCSF name, because of the chance to recruit the students into the residency program, and because of the relationship and experience the students share about NMC with their peers, thus giving NMC a broader audience for recruitment.

The term of this lease agreement is August 1, 2018, through and including January 31, 2020 for a total lease term of eighteen (18) months. Lease payments will be \$1,935 per month. This monthly amount is a discounted rate off the market rate of \$2,150 per month for this unit (\$215 savings per month). NMC is receiving a discounted rate by executing an eighteen month lease term as opposed to a 12 month lease term. The refundable security deposit of \$600 collected from the original lease will be transferred and applied as the security deposit to the new lease. The lease agreement also includes provisions for late payment, return check, after hour key charges and the collection of a refundable security deposit. These charges and conditions are viewed as industry standard for apartment complexes with similar amenities. The County may terminate the new lease upon sixty day written notice.

OTHER AGENCY INVOLVEMENT:

County Counsel has reviewed and approved this lease agreement as to legal form, and the Auditor-Controller has reviewed and approved as to payment provisions. The lease agreement has also been reviewed and approved by NMC's Finance Committee on April 26, 2018 and by its Board of Trustees on May 4, 2018.

FINANCING:

The cost for this lease agreement for an eighteen (18) month period is \$34,830, of which \$21,285 will be included in the Fiscal year 2018-19 Recommended Budget. Costs for future years will be included those budgets as appropriate.

BOARD OF SUPERVISORS STRATEGIC INITIATIVES:

This lease agreement provides a home-like environment when necessary for resident physicians at NMC. Resident physicians provide patient care on many levels at NMC and this rental unit ensures that they are within close proximity to the hospital.

On March 2, 2018 NMC received Five (5) Statement of Qualifications (SOQ)/Proposals from qualified firms submitted for consideration. All 5 SOQ/Proposals were evaluated pursuant to the criteria stated in RFQ #9600-76. One vendor was deemed nonresponsive. Of the remaining four vendors, NMC identified the top three qualified vendors as Kleinfelder Inc., Moore Twining Associates Inc., and RMA Group based on the ranking set forth by the NMC selection committee, and in conformance with state laws regarding qualification based selection, these 3 vendors were tentatively awarded agreements.

The master agreement for materials testing and inspection services is a five (5) year agreement that will be utilized by NMC for these services. Inclusion on the master agreement does not guarantee award of any specific dollar amount.

Vendors will provide construction materials testing and inspection services based off the requirements specified in the Request for Qualifications (RFQ) #9600-76.

OTHER AGENCY INVOLVEMENT:

County Counsel has reviewed and approved the agreements as to legal form, and the Auditor-Controller has reviewed and approved the agreements as to payment provisions. This request was approved by the NMC Finance Committee on April 26, 2018 and by the NMC Board of Trustees on May 4, 2018.

Authorize the Deputy Purchasing Agent for NMC or his designee to execute up to two (2) future amendments, each of would exercise a one year option to extend and add \$170,000 to the agreement, provided that the total cost for the agreement over a five year period does not exceed \$901,000 and so long as an appropriation for the costs of the amendments is included in the County Adopted Budget.

SUMMARY/DISCUSSION:

NMC issued a Request for Proposal (RFP) #9600-79 on February 19, 2018 to solicit for one or more new agreements for marketing and graphic design services from qualified vendors. On March 19, 2018 NMC received six (6) proposals from vendors submitted for consideration. All proposals were evaluated pursuant to the criteria stated in the RFP #9600-79. NMC Upon a thorough selection process NMC identified the top qualified vendors as Schipper Design and AMF Media Group based on the ranking set forth by the NMC selection team. These vendors were tentatively selected to be awarded agreements to provide marketing and graphic design services for NMC. Inclusion on the master agreement does not guarantee award of any specific dollar amount.

Schipper Design, a local marketing and graphic design firm based in San Juan Bautista, brings a diverse wealth of experience and skills for marketing design services. AMF Media Group is an award-winning full-service marketing and communications agency based in San Ramon, California.

The current agreement for marketing and graphic design services expires on June 30, 2018 and is the result of a previous RFP issued by NMC.

NMC will work closely with these vendors in the design and implementation of projects in order to best serve NMC's objectives. This will include providing information, increasing awareness, promoting brand identity, and providing marketing support. The contractors will also provide marketing and graphic design services based on the scope of work specified in the Request for Proposal (RFP) #9600-79.

OTHER AGENCY INVOLVEMENT:

County Counsel has reviewed and approved this agreement as to legal form, and the Auditor-Controller has reviewed and approved as to payment provisions. The agreement has also been reviewed and approved by NMC's Finance Committee on April 26, 2018 and by its Board of Trustees on May 4, 2018.

FINANCING:

The cost for this agreement is \$510,000 of which \$170,000 is included in the Fiscal Year 2018-19 Recommended Budget. Amounts for remaining years of the agreement will be included in those budgets as appropriate.

SUMMARY/DISCUSSION:

Natividad Medical Center seeks approval for an extension of the Agreement for Health Information Exchange Services, pursuant to which Central Coast Health Connect (CCHC) shall perform health information exchange services related to the County's participation in the Health Information Organization (HIO).

Natividad Medical Center is providing the Board of Supervisors the current Participation Agreement for the Health Information Exchange. The scope of work has not been significantly altered and approval not requested. The Participation Agreement is coterminous with the Agreement for Health Information Services.

CCHC was created to oversee and facilitate a Health Information Exchange (HIE), which mobilizes healthcare information electronically across organizations within the Monterey County community. In 2016, NMC joined Community Hospital of Monterey Peninsula (CHOMP) and Salinas Valley Memorial Hospital (SVMH) as the three core Monterey County hospital participants in the HIO. CCHC's founding members are Community Health Innovations, LLC (CHI) and SVMH. CCHC is managed by a Board of Managers. CCHC has contracted with CHI to perform day-to-day management of CCHC.

The purpose and benefit to Monterey County residents of being a hospital participant of CCHC is that the exchange of health information electronic data can improve quality, safety, efficiency, reduce health disparities, lead to improved engagement of patients and families and improve care coordination, population and public health and improve communication between hospitals, clinics and care providers all the while maintaining privacy and security of patient health information.

OTHER AGENCY INVOLVEMENT:

County Counsel has reviewed and approved this amendment No. 1 as to legal form, and the Auditor-Controller has reviewed and approved as to payment provisions. This amendment No. 1 has also been reviewed and approved by NMC's Finance Committee on April 26, 2018 and by its Board of Trustees on May 4, 2018.

FINANCING:

The cost for this amendment No. 1 is \$541,074 of which \$268,432 is included in the Fiscal Year 2018-19 Adopted Budget. Amounts for remaining years of the agreement will be included in those budgets as appropriate. There is no impact to the General Fund.

SUMMARY/DISCUSSION:

Natividad Medical Center currently utilizes the Kronos Timekeeper to capture time for all staff employed and to capture time worked for all contracted staff. In addition, NMC completed implementation of Attendance Manager, Basic Scheduler, Productivity and Human Resources modules.

NMC is requesting the approval of this agreement to allow the facility to continue to utilize the system to calculate hours worked, overtime, shift differential, determine "unscheduled shifts", track call-offs, track absences and tardiness along with tracking employee health data, and other HR information. In addition, Natividad is recommending we add the Advanced Scheduler and Cloud Services to the current system. Advanced Scheduler will allow Natividad to move to online scheduling, automate schedule changes and provide real time schedule access to all hospital staff including twenty-four seven departments and eliminate the need to departments to maintain paper schedules. The addition of Cloud Services will allow Natividad to eliminate the need for Natividad to maintain the system on site and allow Kronos to maintain the core system and ensure that it is always up to date with the latest updates provided by the vendor.

County Counsel has reviewed and approved this agreement as to legal form and risk provisions, and the Auditor-Controller has reviewed and approved as to payment provisions. The agreement has also been reviewed and approved by NMC's Finance Committee on April 26, 2018 and by its Board of Trustees on May 4, 2018.

The cost for this agreement is \$1,439,000 of which \$579,077 which is included in the Fiscal Year 2018-19 Adopted Budget.



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

..Report <u>RECOMMENDATION</u>:

It is recommended the Board of Supervisors:

- a. Authorize the Chief Executive Officer of Natividad Medical Center (NMC) to execute Amendment No. 1 ("Amendment") to Pacific Health Alliance Pilot Project Agreement, to extend program administration (PA) services for the County of Monterey's Pilot Project for the Remaining Uninsured, for an additional amount not to exceed \$200,000, effective July1, 2018 through a run out period of December 31, 2019, subject to further review and approval of County Counsel and the County-Auditor Controller;
- b. Approve and authorize the Chief Executive Officer of NMC to sign up to three (3) one-year amendments that do not exceed ten percent (10%) (\$20,000) of the original Agreement amount and do not significantly alter the scope of services.

SUMMARY/DISCUSSION:

The Affordable Care Act (ACA) was enacted to provide Medicaid (Medi-Cal) and other coverage options through the exchange to many low-income individuals with the goal of decreasing the number of uninsured individuals. However, many Monterey County residents remain uninsured and unable to pay for costly medical care, procedures and prescription medications. Of the uninsured, it is estimated that there are approximately 30,000 to 50,000 adult residents over the age of 18 living in Monterey County without any medical insurance due to their documentation status.

In response to this need, the Board of Supervisors approved an allocation of \$500,000 of General Fund dollars in August 2015 establishing the County's Pilot Project for the Remaining Uninsured to provide limited scope pharmaceuticals, laboratory tests and radiology services. These services were provided by the Health Department's Federally Qualified look-alike health clinics, which serve designated medically underserved populations under the applicable Scope of Project with HRSA (Health Resources and Services Administration), and by Natividad Medical Center. The County's Pilot Project for the Remaining Uninsured was implemented in November 2015 through September 2017 and served approximately 2,005 individuals.

In May 2017, the Board of Supervisors directed staff to proceed with implementation of an expanded Pilot Project allowing for the provision of primary and specialty care ambulatory services for fiscal year 2017/2018 with NMC enterprise funds of \$1.8 million, and \$200,000 for PA services.

On June 27, 2017, the Board of Supervisors approved and authorized the current Agreement with Pacific Health Alliance (PHA) for the County of Monterey's Pilot Project for the Remaining Uninsured, for up to \$200,000, effective July 1, 2017 through June 30, 2018 to assist with the program management and reporting. The project, named Esperanza Care, became effective October 1, 2017. The enrollment cap of 2,500 individuals was raised to 3,500 by the Board of Supervisors effective April 1, 2018.

It is presumed that the Esperanza Care project will roll over to fiscal year 2018/2019 with the same scope of services and an additional expenditure of \$2 million from the NMC enterprise fund. Enrollees in the project will be required to re-apply for the project at least annually.

Natividad Medical Center is working on an amendment with PHA to provide for PA services for fiscal year 2018/2019. To ensure a smooth transition to the next fiscal year, NMC is seeking authorization to execute Amendment 1, effective July 1, 2018 subject to further review and approval of County Counsel and the County Auditor Controller offices.

OTHER AGENCY INVOLVEMENT:

County Counsel and the County Auditor Controller offices will approve the final Amendment 1. The Amendment has been reviewed and approved by NMC's Finance Committee on April 26, 2018 and by the NMC Board of Trustees on May 4, 2018.

FINANCING:

There is no impact to the General Fund.
