### **SUMMARY/DISCUSSION:**

This partnership with the SEARHC is for the purpose of offering an elective one month clinical rotation for Natividad residents. SEARHC offers rural health rotations in Alaska, where residents have the opportunity to learn the skills they would need for a career in full-spectrum rural health care. The Natividad Family Medicine Residency particularly seeks applicants interested in rural health care, as part of our mission is to train family physicians to meet needs of Monterey County patients, including the rural Salinas Valley. Currently Mee Memorial Hospital is unable to support resident rotations, so SEARHC provides an alternative offering that is attractive to current and future residents interested in rural health care.

### **OTHER AGENCY INVOLVEMENT:**

County Counsel reviewed and approved this program letter of agreement as to legal form, and the Auditor-Controller reviewed and approved as to payment provisions. The program letter of agreement has also been reviewed and approved by NMC's Finance Committee on August 22, 2019 and by its Board of Trustees on September 6, 2019.

### **FINANCING:**

There is no cost associated with this program letter of agreement.

### **SUMMARY/DISCUSSION:**

NMC has used Stericycle for Regulated Medical Waste Services prior to this Agreement and has a proven track record of being reliable and capable of meeting the Medical Waste Removal needs of NMC. As medical procedures are performed throughout the facility waste is generated and separated into several types of waste streams. The types of waste steams generated under this banner are: red bag (blood or blood product), sharps waste (scalpel blades, broken glass vails, needles, syringes, etc.), pathological waste (certain types of tissue), trace chemotherapy, bulk chemotherapy, pharmaceutical waste, and RCRA (Resource Conservation and Recovery Act) hazardous medical waste. On average Natividad Medical Center generates 18,000 pounds of the above mentioned waste streams a month.

Medical waste removal services are required by various regulating agencies. The focus of our Waste Compliance is to achieve and maintain Environmental Protection Agency (EPA), Department of Transportation (DOT) and Joint Commission (TJC) compliance, while reducing the risk associated with handling compounds. State regulations require medical waste removal to be done only by a licensed hauler. This Agreement allows NMC to maintain compliance with all regulating agencies.

### This Agreement's services include:

- Bio Hazardous Waste: transportation and processing according to waste stream. Either sterilize and dispose or incinerate waste
- Pathological Waste
- Sharps Management Program
- Resource Conservation and Recovery Act (RCRA) Hazardous Pharmaceutical Waste
- Universal (Pharmaceutical) Waste

This Amendment would have been completed in June prior to the expiration, however, Stericycle submitted very late rate changes causing a delay in completing the amendment.

### **OTHER AGENCY INVOLVEMENT:**

County Counsel reviewed and approved this Renewal and amendment No. 1 as to legal, and the Auditor-Controller has reviewed and approved as to payment provisions. This amendment No. 1 has also been reviewed and approved by NMC's Finance Committee on August 22, 2019 and by its Board of Trustees on September 6, 2019.

### **FINANCING:**

The cost for this Renewal and amendment No. 1 is \$450,000 of which \$225,000 is included in the Fiscal Year 2019-20 Adopted Budget. There is no impact to the General Fund.

### SUMMARY/DISCUSSION:

Natividad Medical Center (NMC) received its designation as the Level II Trauma Center for Monterey County in January 2015. The American College of Surgeons requires neurosurgeons provide dedicated call coverage with a 30 minute response time for Level II Trauma Centers. In order to provide 24/7 care, it is necessary to develop and sustain a core team of quality neurosurgeons to provide daily call coverage in the Emergency Department and follow-up care to patients in the Intensive Care Unit and Specialty Clinic.

Natividad would like to enter into an agreement with Gregory M. Helbig, M.D., Inc., for which Dr. Helbig, a board certified neurosurgeon provides neurosurgery services as part of the comprehensive trauma services required for the Level II Trauma Center activation. Dr. Helbig will be paid a daily rate for coverage services, which may increase due to availability and the need for coverage, but the rate of pay remains the same. Natividad has obtained an independent opinion of fair market value supporting the payment terms of this Agreement.

### OTHER AGENCY INVOLVEMENT:

County Counsel has reviewed and approved this Amendment as to legal form. Auditor-Controller has reviewed and approved this Amendment as to fiscal provisions. [The Amendment has also been reviewed and approved by Natividad Medical Center's Finance Committee on August 22, 2019 and Board of Trustees on September 6, 2019]

### FINANCING:

The total cost of this Agreement is \$500,000. The actual cost is contingent upon Dr. Helbig's participation in the call panel which may fluctuate based on his availability. Natividad has agreements with multiple providers to ensure sufficient coverage of the neurosurgery services where the total expenditure will not exceed \$1,300,000 annually which is included in Fiscal Year 2019/2020 recommended budget. The remaining balance will be budgeted in subsequent fiscal years. There is no impact to the General Fund.

The services rendered in this agreement provide NMC with the additional support it needs in order to provide reliable and high quality patient care which improves the health and quality of life for patients and their families.

### SUMMARY/DISCUSSION:

Natividad Medical Center (NMC) received its designation as the Level II Trauma Center for Monterey County in January 2015. The American College of Surgeons requires neurosurgeons provide dedicated call coverage with a 30 minute response time for Level II Trauma Centers. In order to provide 24/7 care, it is necessary to develop and sustain a core team of quality neurosurgeons to provide daily call coverage in the Emergency Department and follow-up care to patients in the Intensive Care Unit and Specialty Clinic.

Natividad would like to enter into an agreement with Frank Acosta MD, a board certified neurosurgeon, to provide neurosurgery services as part of the comprehensive trauma services required for the Level II Trauma Center activation. Dr. Acosta will be paid a daily rate for coverage services, which may increase due to availability and the need for coverage, but the rate of pay remains the same. Natividad has obtained an independent opinion of fair market value supporting the payment terms of this Agreement.

### OTHER AGENCY INVOLVEMENT:

### TITLE:

- b. Authorize the Deputy Purchasing Agent for NMC to sign up to three (3) future amendments to this agreement where the total amendments do not significantly change the scope of work and do not cause an increase of more than ten percent 10% (\$50,000) of the original contract amount.

### RECOMMENDATION:

It is recommended that the Board of Supervisors

- a. Authorize the Deputy Purchasing Agent for Natividad Medical Center (NMC) or his designee to execute the Professional and Call Coverage Services Agreement with Monterey Spine and Joint PC to provide neurosurgery services for an amount not to exceed \$500,000 for the period October 1, 2019 to September 30, 2021; and
- b. Authorize the Deputy Purchasing Agent for NMC to sign up to three (3) future amendments to this agreement where the total amendments do not significantly change the scope of work and do not cause an increase of more than ten percent 10% (\$50,000) of the original contract amount.

### SUMMARY/DISCUSSION:

Natividad Medical Center (NMC) received its designation as the Level II Trauma Center for Monterey County in January 2015. The American College of Surgeons requires neurosurgeons provide dedicated call coverage with a 30 minute response time for Level II Trauma Centers. In order to provide 24/7 care, it is necessary to develop and sustain a core team of quality neurosurgeons to provide daily call coverage in the Emergency Department and follow-up care to patients in the Intensive Care Unit and Specialty Clinic.

Natividad would like to enter into an agreement with Monterey Spine and Joint PC, for which board certified neurosurgeons provide neurosurgery services as part of the comprehensive trauma services required for the Level II Trauma Center activation. Monterey Spine and Joint will be paid a daily rate for coverage services, which may increase due to availability and the need for coverage, but the rate of pay remains the same. Natividad has obtained an independent opinion of fair market value supporting the payment terms of this Agreement.

### **OTHER AGENCY INVOLVEMENT:**

County Counsel has reviewed and approved this Amendment as to legal form. Auditor-Controller has reviewed and approved this Amendment as to fiscal provisions. [The Amendment has also been reviewed and approved by Natividad Medical Center's Finance Committee on August 22, 2019 and Board of Trustees on September 6, 2019]

The remaining balance will be budgeted in subsequent fiscal years. There is no impact to the General Fund.

### **SUMMARY/DISCUSSION:**

Natividad recommends that the salary range for the Speech Pathologist classification listed in the attached resolution be adjusted as indicated.

Speech Pathologist was a classification created in 2015 to provide professional speech pathology diagnostic treatment services to assist patients with communication, voice and swallowing disorders of inpatients and outpatients in a hospital setting. Prior to creation, the development, implementation and documentation of treatment plans and goals designed to meet patient needs including the special population of Neonatal Intensive Care infants and pediatric patients were performed by contract staff.

The proposed salary adjustment listed below is based on an external wage comparison conducted by Natividad, which includes comparable Counties with medical facilities.

50G41	Speech Pathologist	\$5,910 - \$8,068	\$6,842 - \$9,345

The approval of this salary adjustment will support Natividad's ongoing efforts to improve patient outcomes, and continue to minimize the usage of contract staff within Natividad as we will be able to recruit and retain qualified staff. The current range is 15.83% below the average salary paid by comparable counties with hospital facilities. Therefore, it is recommended that the Board approve this action.

### **OTHER AGENCY INVOLVEMENT:**

Natividad consulted with the Monterey County Human Resources Department/Labor Division regarding this recommendation.

### ..Report RECOMMENDATION:

It is recommended that the Board of Supervisors:

Authorize the Deputy Purchasing Agent of NMC to execute a Health Plan-Provider Agreement with the Fresno-Kings-Madera Regional Health Authority dba CalViva Health, a Medi-Cal Managed Care Plan ("CalViva") to provide for Medi-Cal managed care rate payment increases to NMC for healthcare services rendered in the period of July 1, 2018 to June 30, 2019, to CalViva's Medi-Cal managed care enrollees.

### **SUMMARY/DISCUSSION:**

DHCS administers the Medi-Cal program, under which health care services are provided to qualified low-income persons. Inpatient and outpatient hospital services are a covered benefit under the Medi-Cal program, subject to utilization controls. Existing law provides for Medi-Cal payments to hospitals.

An IGT is an elective transfer of eligible local dollars to the State DHCS in support of the Medi-Cal program, which is authorized in accordance with Section 14164 and other provisions of the Welfare and Institutions Code that are typically program specific. If the State accepts the transfer, the State shall obtain Federal Financial Participation ("FFP") to the full extent permitted by federal law.

In the past, NMC has voluntarily provided IGTs to DHCS in support of the Medi-Cal managed care program as authorized pursuant to Section 14301.4 of the Welfare and Institutions Code. The local fund transfers are effectuated pursuant to an IGT agreement (and an IGT fee assessment agreement if applicable) between the State DHCS and the participating public provider/entity. The opportunity to participate in providing such voluntary IGTs allows for the use of local dollars to make increased payments from plans available to public providers such as NMC to preserve and strengthen the availability and quality of services provided by such providers.

In Monterey County, the Monterey-Santa Cruz-Merced Managed Medical Care Commission d/b/a Central California Alliance for Health ("CCAH") is the local County Organized Health System, which has an existing agreement with NMC to provide clinical and other medical care services covered by Medi-Cal to enrollees of the Plan. NMC participated in the voluntary Rate

Range IGT program for the 2017-18 rate year, and has received approximately 82.55% of the available rate increases from CCAH. On June 18, 2019, the Board of Supervisors authorized Board Order A-14351 for the agreement with State DHCS and the local Medi-Cal Plan CCAH.

Natividad also provides services to Medi-Cal managed care enrollees of the Fresno-Kings-Madera Regional Health Authority, dba CalViva Health ("CalViva"). Due to additional funds availability from CalViva, Natividad requests board approval of an agreement with CalViva for payment increases with respect to the services provided ("Health Plan-Provider Agreement"). It is estimated that approximately \$1,300,000 to \$1,400,000 would be available to Natividad as payment increases. The total amount that is actually available will vary, based, among other factors, the number of the particular health plan's Medi-Cal managed care enrollees.

The Board could choose not to participate, in which case NMC and the County would be precluded from participating in this portion of the IGT program for the period of July 1, 2018 to June 30, 2019.

### OTHER AGENCY INVOLVMENT:

County Counsel has reviewed and approved the Health Plan-Provider Agreement as to legal form. The Auditor-Controller has reviewed and approved the Health Plan-Provider Agreement as to fiscal provisions. The Health Plan-Provider Agreement has been reviewed and approved by the NMC Finance Committee on August 22, 2019 and the Board of Trustees on September 6, 2019.

### **FINANCING:**

The expected IGT transfer will be financed by NMC. There is no impact to the General Fund.

### **BOARD OF SUPERVISORS STRATEGIC INITIATIVES:**

The opportunity to participate in an IGT allows for the use of local dollars to obtain the federal matching in payments available for public providers such as Natividad and preserve and strengthen the safety net services in Monterey County.

Kit Check provides scanning equipment and web-based software which enables NMC to automate its pharmacy kit processing. Kit Check supplies equipment consisting of 1 scanning station, 1 RFI printer suitable for printing the Kit Check RFID labels, and 1 desktop barcode scanner which is used in conjunction with Kit Check's web-based kit processing software.

Kit Check has provided installation services and training for authorized personnel in the use of the equipment and software services. Kit Check also supplies NMC with the RFID labels and tags suitable for use with the RFID printer which come in two forms, a regular tag used on various surfaces and a metal-mount tag can be used specifically to affix to metal surfaces.

NMC wishes to amend this agreement to add funds due to greater than anticipated increases in both the types and quantities of emergency kits as well as the sudden unavailability of pre-tagged compounded items available from our outsourcing facilities.

County Counsel has reviewed and approved this amendment No. 2 as to legal form, and the Auditor-Controller has reviewed and approved as to pay 2 4 t provisions. The amendment No. 2 has also

MD Buyline provides Natividad with access to its online cost analysis services which are fully automated. These cost analysis services compare new equipment quotes against other current costs in the active marketplace in real time. The reports that are auto-generated will include a cost comparative analysis and also provide Natividad with suggestions as to which areas can be more easily negotiated down. Natividad has found these reports to be extremely helpful during the procurement of medical equipment to ensure it receives competitive pricing. As a result, Natividad can make new product decisions with greater efficiency, transparency and documentation.

The original agreement with MD Buyline was executed in January 2018 for a total cost of \$91,996 with an agreement term of January 3, 2018 through January 2, 2022. This amendment No. 1 includes the addition of consulting services on an as-needed basis only specifically related to more detailed or complex equipment purchase agreements, including ongoing equipment maintenance agreements for products both in and out of warranty. Natividad believes utilizing these consulting services would yield the necessary inside-industry data that would provide Natividad more leverage to negotiate the cost down significantly on certain items.

For over 30 years, MD Buyline has provided hospitals with strategic sourcing data and advisory services supporting all types of medical equipment and technologies acquisitions including consumables.

### **OTHER AGENCY INVOLVEMENT:**

County Counsel has reviewed and approved this amendment No. 1 as to legal form, and the Auditor-Controller has reviewed and approved as to payment provisions. 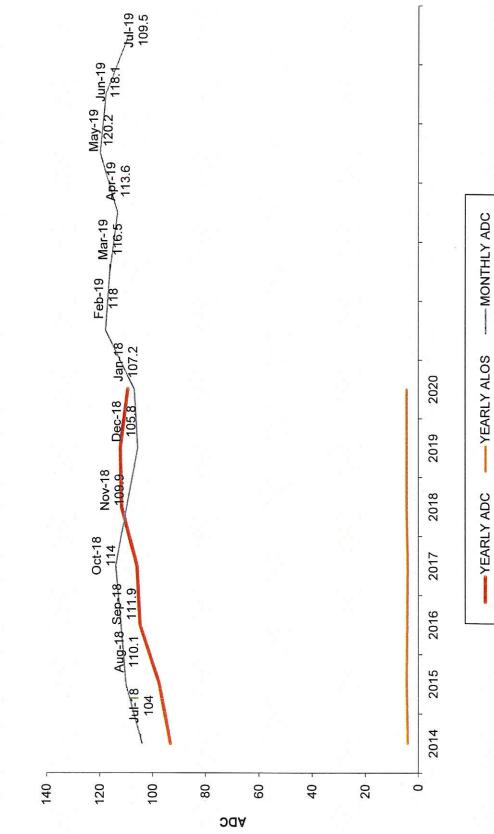

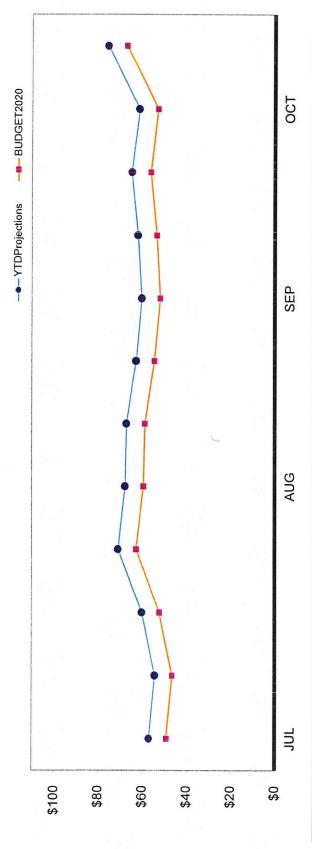
