SUMMARY/DISCUSSION:

The Federal Center for Medicaid and Medicare Services (CMS) approved a five-year renewal of California's Section 1115 Medicaid Waiver on December 30, 2015. The Waiver provided California with over \$6.2 billion in new federal funding for programs that shifted the focus away from hospital-based and inpatient care towards outpatient, primary, and preventive care, thus shifting the focus from volume to value.

The Public Hospital Redesign and Incentives in Medi-Cal (PRIME) is a pay-for-performance delivery system transformation and alignment program. NMC engaged the services of Jane Finney in November of 2015 for consulting and project management services specific to the PRIME program.

In July of 2017, the California Department of Public Health implemented the Quality Incentive Program (QIP). QIP payments are tied to performance on designated performance metrics in four strategic categories: primary care, specialty care, inpatient care, and resource utilization. When fully implemented QIP will incorporate current PRIME metrics and will require ongoing performance improvement work and data reporting.

This new agreement will allow Ms. Finney to continue to perform the services for work associated with the PRIME and QIP programs. Services include implementation of milestones, execution of required programs, and further timely submission of required reports to the California Department of Health Care Services and other agencies.

OTHER AGENCY INVOLVEMENT:

The Office of County Counsel has reviewed and approved this agreement as to form, and the Auditor-Controller has reviewed and approved as to payment provisions. The agreement also been

reviewed and approved by NMC's Finance Committee on and by its Board of Trustees on November 13, 2020

FINANCING:

The cost for this agreement is \$150,000, all of which is included in the Fiscal Year 2020-21 Adopted Budget.

Everbridge is a critical event management software system that has been utilized by Natividad since January 2018. It allows Natividad the ability to perform mass callings to all hospital staff and is utilized when there are notifications that need to get out to a large number of employees at once; this includes emergency situations and can be used if there are mass casualty/triage events. This system is also utilized to contact specific groups of people when needed during accreditation surveys (TJC, CMS, etc.) as an alternate means of communicating updates. Natividad is requesting to add a feature that will allow employees and patients the ability to also subscribe to text message updates when emergencies are in process and ongoing updates are needed for staff and the community.

Everbridge is a web based system that stores and updates telephone numbers for all staff members within the hospital in a single location. It is readily accessible from anywhere that has access to the internet. Within the system, NMC has the ability to select targeted groups of employees and in various ways all while the system tracks communications and verifications. This Amendment adds \$6,500 to the Agreement which is necessary to extend the agreement and add the additional subscription feature.

OTHER AGENCY INVOLVEMENT:

The Office of County Counsel has reviewed and approved this amendment No. 2 as to form, and the Auditor-Controller has reviewed and approved as to payment provisions. In 2019, Natividad amended the agreement to transition software support of the BMC Client Management tool from a different vendor to Flycast Partners for a one (1) year period. As a BMC Solutions Partner, Flycast Partners is able to provide an improved level of support at a discounted rate.

This amendment extends the software support for BMC Client Management for an additional three (3) years, thereby adding two years to the overall term of the agreement.

RECOMMENDATION:

SUMMARY/DISCUSSION:

California Public Contract Code (PPC) Section 20128.5 provides that counties may award annual contracts for repair, remodeling or other repetitive work to be done according to unit prices. This is commonly referred to as Job Order Contracting (JOC), and is typically done by developing a construction task catalog that is then competitively bid. Job Order Contracting improves economy and efficiency in completing many public improvement projects, including urgent and time sensitive projects.

In April 2013, the Board of Supervisors (Board) approved an Agreement between the County of Monterey (County) and The Gordian Group, Inc. to provide the County with a JOC System. The Gordian Group job order contracting system uses an extensive catalog of construction tasks and associated technical specifications containing over 260,000 individual items specifically designed for Monterey County. Per PCC Section 20128.5, the Board may award individual annual contracts which shall not exceed the statutory maximum contract value. Per PCC Section 20128.5, each awarded contract has a maximum contract value (MxCV) that is adjusted annually to reflect the percentage change in the California Consumer Price Index (CPI), for repair, remodeling, or other repetitive work to be done according to unit prices. The percentage change in the CPI is calculated and provided by the Department of Industrial Relations (DIR). Per DIR's annual determination, the MxCV for JOC contracts was increased from \$4,949,291 in 2020 to \$5,098,418 in 2021. County JOC specifications provide for a one (1) year term with \$25,000 worth of work guaranteed for each individual contract.

County JOC specifications require Contractors to provide a letter from a bonding company stating their ability to obtain Payment and Performance Bonds for the MxCV. This year for NMC bids, staff recommends that Monterey County require the successful bidder to furnish an initial payment bond and a performance bond for approximately fifty percent (50%) of the MxCV, each in the amount of \$2,500,000. If the aggregate Job Orders issued under any of the awarded Facilities Contracts exceed \$2,500,000, an increase in the Payment and Performance bonds for the corresponding Facilities Contract will be required in an amount not less than one hundred percent (100%) of the MxCV of \$5,098,418. The lower initial bonding requirement for NMC Contracts is recommended to attract Contractors who may otherwise not bid on the Facilities projects due to the high bonding requirement relative to the guaranteed work of \$25,000.

With the amount of capital projects slated for fiscal year (FY) 2020-21, it is recommended by the Gordian Group to advertise three (3) separate Job Order Contracts. Each contract would be awarded to three (3) separate contractors allowing NMC the option to use the alternate contractor if one of the contractors is deemed nonresponsive or has poor performance. Any Job Order that would exceed \$1 million will be brought to the Capital Improvement Committee (CIC) prior to issuing the Notice to Proceed. The

contracts will apply to eligible projects during FY 2020-21. The JOC contract will not exceed beyond a twelve (12) month contract for issuing of job orders. Any capital and/or facilities maintenance repair project that enters into FY 2020-21 will be budgeted after final approval by the Board.

OTHER AGENCY INVOLVEMENT:

County Counsel has reviewed and approved this Agreement as to legal form and risk provisions. Auditor-Controller has reviewed and approved this Agreement as to fiscal provisions.

FINANCING:

The 2021 JOC Program would provide for three (3) individual NMC Job Order Contracts with a cap of \$5,098,418 for a total of \$15,295,254. Expenditures will be within and not exceed the FY 2020-21 and future FY proposed capital budgets approval by the Board of Supervisors.

Funding for the projects will come from NMC's Capital Reserve Fund. A five percent (5%) License Fee to utilize the JOC program is payable to the Gordian Group only if and when a Job Order is issued to a JOC Contractor. Optionally, as needed, the County may utilize JOC Project Management services for an additional 5.95% fee. Gordian fees are contained in the overall eligible project budgets.

BOARD OF SUPERVISORS STRATEGIC INITIATIVES:

The JOC program helps with providing efficient and effective hospital operations by allowing improved processing for smaller and more urgent projects. The JOC program projects include improvements to health and safety facilities. Provision of adequate County facilities and infrastructure improves the quality of life for County residents and supports economic development results.

Authorize the Deputy Purchasing Agent for Natividad Medical Center (NMC) or his designee to execute amendment No. 6 to the agreement (A-13506) with Focus One Solutions, LLC for a Healthcare Vendor Management System pursuant to the Request for Proposal (RFP) # 9600-62, adding \$10,000,000 for a revised total agreement amount not to exceed \$30,563,000 and with no changes to the current agreement term of April 19, 2020 through June April 18, 2022.

SUMMARY/DISCUSSION:

Natividad Medical Center utilizes the registry services provided by Focus One to staff hard to fill clinical positions and to obtain extra staff to cover anticipated staff needs during the COVID-19 pandemic. Focus One has assisted the hospital by ensuring that we are able to meet the hospital's staffing needs to ensure high quality patient care. Focus One Solutions provides NMC a one stop search agency for nurses and other clinical staff. Focus One has a network of over four dozen independent agencies that provide the needed staff. Natividad uses the registry services to fill positions in the following areas on a temporary basis: Emergency Department, Intensive Care Unit, Medical Surgical Unit, Labor and Delivery, Surgery, Neonatal Intensive Care, Mental Health Unit, Rehabilitation, Physical and Occupational Therapy Services, Diagnostic Imaging, Interventional Radiology, Clinical Laboratory and Pharmacy.

Natividad is requesting an additional \$10,000,000 to assist with covering the costs of additional nursing staff needed due to the increased need for Intensive Care Unit and Medical Surgical nurses. An increase in nurses for these areas is due to the increase in these specific types of patients and the increased acuity of the patients resulting in more nurses needed; nurse to patient ratios in these areas are many times a 1:1 or a 1:2 due to the COVID-19 pandemic, and in order to meet these ratios, registry staff is needed.

Focus One Solutions, LLC was selected through a competitive solicitation process. Natividad issued a Request for Proposal (RFP) #9600-62 on August 22, 2016 to solicit for a new agreement for a healthcare vendor management system from a qualified contractor. Four (4) proposals were received for consideration from interested vendors. Upon a thorough selection process by Natividad which included online demonstrations of the vendor management system, Focus One Solutions, LLC was awarded the agreement. There is no cost to NMC for utilization of the Vendor Management System as the vendor is paid by the registry companies for their services. Therefore, the total amount paid by NMC is for services performed by the registry staff.

The Office of County Counsel has reviewed and approved this amendment No.6 as to form, and the Auditor-Controller has reviewed and approved as to payment provisions. The amendment No. 6 has also been reviewed and approved by NMC's Finance Committee and by its Board of Trustees on November 13, 2020.

FINANCING:

The cost for this No. 6 is \$10,000,000 of which \$4,000,000 is included in the Fiscal Year 2020-21 Adopted Budget. Amounts for remaining years of the agreement will be included in those budgets as appropriate.

BOARD OF SUPERVISORS STRATEGIC INITIATIVES:

This agreement greatly improves the responsiveness to critical staffing needs at NMC. This agreement ensures that requests for qualified nurses and other clinical staff at NMC are met in a timely manner. This enables NMC to provide high quality patient care thereby improving the health and quality of life for patients and their families.

SUMMARY/DISCUSSION:

NMC has a need for IT consulting services and specialized subject matter expertise to help NMC analyze, design and implement new computer applications, functionality, and define process and training which support those applications and functionality.

NMC prepared and released RFP #9600-67 on August 1, 2016 to select qualified consulting companies to fulfill the unique needs associated with special IT projects. This RFP required that bidders be able to provide expertise for all aspects of application development, clinical IT expertise and high-level maintenance services at NMC. Eight (8) proposals were received for consideration from interested and qualified contractors. All 8 proposals were evaluated pursuant to the criteria stated in RFP #9600-67 and Leidos Health, LLC (now Leidos Health, LLC dba The Ettain Group), Jacobus Consulting, Inc., and Navin Haffty & Associates, LLC were all tentatively awarded agreements, however Jacobus Consulting. Inc has since exited the healthcare consulting business.

NMC's IT staff work in conjunction with clinical IT consultants who are subject matter experts and also provide a high level of project management to help NMC analyze, design and implement new computer applications, functionality, and define process and training which support those applications and functionality. IT Consultants are also needed as process and data experts for government initiatives such as PRIME (Public Hospital Redesign and Incentives in Medi-Cal Experience) and QIP (Quality Incentive Program). The need for consultants will occur as new hospital initiatives continue to arise.

NMC is projecting continued consulting services shall be needed in four primary areas:

- 1) Business Intelligence (BI) / Analytics
- 2) Clinical and Reporting Expertise
- 3) Implementation of Capital Projects such as Electronic Health Record (EHR) enhancements

NMC continues to strive to fill all its budgeted FTE IT positions with internal expertise and will use consultants for short term projects and where internal knowledge or resources are not available.

NMC is requesting authorization to extend agreements with Navin Haffty & Associates and Leidos Health dba The Ettain Group for an additional year and increasing the agreement funding by \$4,200,000 to \$14,481,000. NMC extended existing agreements in January of 2020 without increasing funding.

OTHER AGENCY INVOLVEMENT:

The Office of County Counsel has reviewed and approved this amendment No. 4 as to form, and the Auditor-Controller has reviewed and approved as to payment provisions. The amendment No. 4 has also been reviewed and approved by NMC's Finance Committee and by its Board of Trustees on November 13, 2020.

FINANCING:

The cost for this amendment No. 4 is \$4,200,000 of which \$2,215,000 is included in the Fiscal Year 2020-21 Adopted Budget. Amounts for remaining years of the agreement will be included in those budgets as appropriate.

OTHER AGENCY INVOLVEMENT:

Natividad currently provides the majority of emergency and inpatient care in Monterey County with over 100,000 visits over the last five years.

Natividad has an agreement with Dr. Sakai to provide pediatric hospitalist from time to time and during periods when employed/contracted physicians are not available (e.g., vacation; illness; continuing medical education; etc.) Natividad would like to amend the agreement to add funds so that Dr. Sakai can continue to provide the same services without interruption. Natividad has obtained an independent opinion of fair market value supporting the payment terms of this Agreement.

OTHER AGENCY INVOLVEMENT:

County Counsel has reviewed and approved this amendment as to legal form. Auditor-Controller has reviewed and approved this amendment as to fiscal provisions. The amendment has also been reviewed and approved by Natividad Medical Center's Finance Committee and Board of Trustees on November 13, 2020

NMC has an agreement with Muralidhara R. Raju M.D., a board certified neurosurgeon, to provide neurosurgery services along with other panel members as part of the comprehensive trauma services required for the Level II Trauma Center. Natividad wishes to amend the agreement to extend the term and add funds to the aggregate amount payable so that Dr. Raju can continue to provide services without interruption. Natividad has obtained an independent opinion of fair market value supporting the payment terms of this Agreement.

OTHER AGENCY INVOLVEMENT:

County Counsel has reviewed and approved this Amendment as to legal form. Auditor-Controller has reviewed and approved this Amendment as to fiscal provisions. SUMMARY/DISCUSSION:

The Sam Karas Acute Rehab Unit at Natividad has a network of physical, occupational and speech therapy staff who work closely with nursing to provide a comprehensive Acute Rehab program. We are recognized by the Center for Accreditation in Acute Rehab in both medical and stroke specialty.

Our program is unique as patients have a longer length of stay, required three hours minimum of therapy, five days a week with a minimum of two of three disciplines in order to meet Medicare guidelines. It is the highest and most aggressive level of rehab and an invaluable experience, unique to this level of hospital rehab and allows the students exposure required during their course program.

It dually serves the Acute Rehab Unit as these students bring new and current therapy standards along with what is up and coming in the market. They allow additional time and experience to our patients and allow a mentoring program for our staff so they also can stay current with the trending and quickly changing medical field.

There is an opportunity for the Acute Hospital Therapy staff to also utilize this program and these students. The benefit here is seeing how a patient on the acute side of the hospital has the potential to transition to the Acute Rehab unit and return home.

The advantage of adding a program like Baylor would be to capture all disciplines of therapy under this umbrella. We have no schools currently who offer this specific feature. We value student input and Baylor has an excellent reputation for excellence.

OTHER AGENCY INVOLVEMENT:

The Office of County Counsel has reviewed and approved this agreement as to form. The agreement was reviewed and approved by NMC's Finance Committee and by its Board of Trustees on November 13, 2020.

FINANCING:

There is no cost associated with this education agreement.

Our ultimate goal is to capture Physical, Occupation or Speech Therapy students with a passion in rehab post-graduation. Many of them are unfamiliar with the level of rehab we offer. Authorize the Chief Executive Officer for Natividad Medical Center (NMC) or his designee to execute amendment No. 7 to the agreement (A-14052) with CenturyLink Communications LLC for Lumen Security Log Monitoring services, extending the agreement an additional three (3) year period (December 1, 2020 through November 30, 2023) for a revised full agreement term of July 21, 2015 through November 30, 2023, and adding \$186,853 for a revised total agreement amount not to exceed \$563,226.

b. Authorize the Deputy Purchasing Agent for NMC or his designee to execute up to three (3) future addendums to the agreement which do not significantly alter the scope of work and do not cause an increase of more than ten percent (10%) (\$10,549) of the original cost of the agreement.

..Report RECOMMENDATION:

It is recommended the Board of Supervisors:

a. Authorize the Chief Executive Officer for Natividad Medical Center (NMC) or his designee to execute amendment No. 7 to the agreement (A-14052) with CenturyLink Communications LLC for Lumen Security Log Monitoring services, extending the agreement an additional three (3) year period (December 1, 2020 through November 30, 2023) for a revised full agreement term of July 21, 2015 through November 30, 2023, and adding \$186,853 for a revised total agreement amount not to exceed \$563,226.

b. Authorize the Deputy Purchasing Agent for NMC or his designee to execute up to three (3) future addendums to the agreement which do not significantly alter the scope of work and do not cause an increase of more than ten percent (10%) (\$10,549) of the original cost of the agreement.

SUMMARY/DISCUSSION:

On July 21, 2015, the Board of Supervisors approved a three-year Master Agreement with CenturyLink Communications (CenturyLink) to provide managed hosting and co-location and disaster recovery services, supporting the Enterprise Resource Planning (ERP) System for Monterey County and also for Natividad Medical Center systems. Thereafter, in May 2017, Cyxtera Technologies, Inc. (Cyxtera) acquired CenturyLink's co-location and disaster recovery business while CenturyLink retained their hosting services.

Natividad has a growing need to implement around the clock advanced monitoring of anomalous events occurring on the hospital's complex information system. The proposed service tracks incidents in real time, applies advanced analytics, categorizes them and sends them to the Lumen team of experts for review. Depending on the outcome of their analysis, their team will prioritize, notify and escalate incidents to the Natividad IT security group.

The Lumen Security Monitoring Service will amplify Natividad's information security efforts and better prepare the hospital to identify, protect, detect and respond to unauthorized access, Ransomware, breaches and other malicious disruptions.

OTHER AGENCY INVOLVEMENT:

The Office of County Counsel has reviewed and approved these documents as to legal form, and the Auditor-Controller has reviewed and approved as to payment provisions. The documents have also been reviewed and approved by NMC's Finance Committee and its Board of Trustees on November 13, 2020.

FINANCING:

The cost of this amendment No. 7 is \$186,853, of which \$36,333 has been included in the Fiscal Year 2020-21 Adopted Budget. Amounts for remaining years of the agreement will be included in those budgets as appropriate.

BOARD OF SUPERVISORS STRATEGIC INITIATIVES:

This initiative helps Natividad guard against unauthorized access to computer systems, assist with preventing or mitigating against privacy breaches and address the emergent threat of ransomware.

Monterey Anesthesia Professionals Agreement

TITLE:

a. Authorize the Chief Executive Officer for Natividad or his designee to execute the Professional and Call Coverage Services Agreement with Monterey Anesthesia Professionals (MAP) to provide anesthesia services for the period January 1, 2021 to December 31, 2021, for an amount not to exceed amount of \$4,200,000 in the aggregate; and b. Authorize the Chief Executive Officer for Natividad or his designee to sign up to three (3) future amendments to this Agreement where the total amendments do not exceed 10% (\$420,000) of the original contract amount and do not significantly change the scope of work.

RECOMMENDATION:

It is recommended that the Board of Supervisors:

a. Authorize the Chief Executive Officer for Natividad or his designee to execute the Professional and Call Coverage Services Agreement with Monterey Anesthesia Professionals (MAP) to provide anesthesia services for the period January 1, 2021 to December 31, 2021, for an amount not to exceed amount of \$4,200,000 in the aggregate; and b. Authorize the Chief Executive Officer for Natividad or his designee to sign up to three (3) future amendments to this Agreement where the total amendments do not exceed 10% (\$420,000) of the original contract amount and do not significantly change the scope of work.

SUMMARY/DISCUSSION:

Natividad would like to renew the agreement with Monterey Anesthesia Professionals to provide sufficient staffing to cover its five operating rooms, including a physician that is immediately available in-house 24 hours a day and one back-up physician that is available on-call 24 hours a day in accordance with American College of Surgeons (ACS) guidelines for a Level II Trauma Center; 24 hours a day anesthesia services within the hospital's labor and delivery suites; and anesthesia services such as airway management (intubations), central line insertion and acute postoperative pain management. MAP also provides a physician to serve as medical director for general administration and oversight of the anesthesia services. NMC has obtained an independent opinion of fair market value supporting the payment terms of this Agreement.

OTHER AGENCY INVOLVEMENT:

County Counsel has reviewed and approved this Agreement as to legal form. Auditor-Controller has reviewed and approved this Agreement as to fiscal provisions. The Agreement has also been reviewed and approved by Natividad Medical Center's Finance Committee and Board of Trustees on November 13, 2020.

FINANCING:

The cost of this Agreement is \$4,200,000 for the period January 1, 2021 to December 31, 2021. \$2,100,000 is included in the Fiscal Year 2020/2021 Adopted Budget. The remaining amount will be budgeted in subsequent fiscal years. There is no impact to the General Fund.




