Service Descriptions

SELF-PAY DISCOUNT PROGRAMS/ CHARITY CARE PROGRAM

Natividad offers various self-pay discount and charity programs. Under these programs, patients pay a reduced portion of Natividad bills.

HOSPITAL PRESUMPTIVE ELIGIBILITY (HPE)

A hospital-issued Medi-Cal program that focuses on providing immediate access to needed health care services while putting people on a path to ongoing coverage. HPE will provide temporary, no-cost Medi-Cal benefits for up to two months, and is temporarily available twice during any one-year time frame.

MEDI-CAL ACCESS PROGRAM FOR PREGNANT WOMEN (MCAP)

(MCAP) provides middle-income pregnant women with comprehensive coverage at low cost with no co-payments or deductibles for its covered services.

BREAST AND CERVICAL CANCER TREATMENT PROGRAM (BCCTP)

This program is offered to individuals who have been diagnosed with breast and/or cervical cancer. The program includes treatment and follow-up care services.

PRESUMPTIVE ELIGIBILITY (PE) FOR PREGNANT WOMEN

A Medi-Cal program that provides immediate coverage for low-income pregnant women for two months while they apply for Medi-Cal, including Restricted Medi-Cal.

RESTRICTED MEDI-CAL PROGRAMS

Restricted Medi-Cal programs are for individuals who are ineligible for Medi-Cal but who require medical attention due to a medical emergency.

MEDICARE

If you have questions about COVID-19 or think you need to get tested, call Natividad's Coronavirus hotline at (831) 772-7365. Our bilingual nurses are available to provide you with virtual screenings if you have symptoms like cough and fever. They can also provide you with information about local testing sites.

There are many resources for insured, uninsured and undocumented people in California. There is also a new Medi-Cal program for people who don't have insurance and need COVID-19 testing. If you need more medical care beyond COVID-19 testing, Natividad will work with you to get the care you need at a reasonable cost or no cost. If you don't qualify, we will help you apply for financial aid or other programs. For information about those programs, call (831) 755-4165.
