Natividad wishes to amend the current agreement with Dr. Serio so that he can continue to provide the services without interruption.

Dr. Serio is paid a rate for services according to the terms of this agreement. Although the amount of services may increase or decrease due to patient volumes and the need for coverage, the rate of pay remains the same. Natividad has obtained an independent opinion of fair market value supporting the payment terms of this Agreement.

OTHER AGENCY INVOLVEMENT:

County Counsel has reviewed and approved this Amendment as to legal form. Auditor-Controller has reviewed and approved this Amendment as to fiscal provisions. The Amendment has also been reviewed and approved by Natividad Medical Center's Finance Committee and Board of Trustee.

FINANCING:

The cost of this Amendment is \$610,000. The total cost for this Agreement is \$3,100,000 (for the period July 1, 2017 to July 31, 2022 (61 months). \$610,000 is included in the Fiscal Year

2021/2022 Adopted Budget. The remaining amount will be budgeted in subsequent fiscal years. There is no impact to the General Fund.

Advanced Gastroenterology of Monterey County is paid a rate for services according to the terms of this agreement. Although the amount of services may increase or decrease due to patient volumes and the need for coverage, the rate of pay remains the same. Natividad has obtained an independent opinion of fair market value supporting the payment terms of this Agreement.

RECOMMENDATION:

SUMMARY/DISCUSSION:

Natividad Medical Center entered into a Professional and Call Coverage Services Agreement with CEP America-Psychiatry, PC, a California professional corporation dba Vituity, to provide psychiatry services at NMC for the period of June 1, 2021 to May 31, 2024. Through this agreement, Vituity, a comprehensive acute care psychiatric provider group, will provide 24/7 dedicated physician staffing and leadership for the hospital's Mental Health Unit and telepsychiatry services, oversight and medical direction of the unit, and consult liaison services for medical and surgical inpatients.

Natividad recommends transferring two (2) full-time Psychiatric Social Worker I positions currently providing services in the hospital's Mental Health Unit from the Health Department budget to the Natividad budget. This recommendation allows Natividad to provide continuity of care and consistency in practice to patients by assigning the hospital with full oversight and management of these services being provided to its mental health patients.

Approval of the recommended actions in this report will direct the execution of a staff transition plan and facilitate the transfer of the two (2) Psychiatric Social Worker I employees who have agreed to transfer to Natividad. This transfer of existing staff will allow for the continuous provision of patient care without disruption to patients.

OTHER AGENCY INVOLVEMENT:

Natividad and the Health Department have worked with SEIU to address questions and concerns of the impacted employees regarding the transfer. The County Administrative Office Budget Office, Auditor-Controller, County Counsel, and Human Resources have reviewed the recommendation.

FINANCING:

The annualized fiscal impact of this action is approximately \$181,087, which will be absorbed in the FY 2021-2022 Natividad Budget. There is no impact to the General Fund resulting from the approval of the recommended action.

- b. Accept non-standard contract provisions as recommended by the Chief Executive Officer for NMC; and
- c. Authorize the Chief Executive Officer for NMC to sign order confirmations on an as-needed basis pursuant this Agreement over the period of September 1, 2021 through August 31, 2024.

..Report RECOMMENDATION:

It is recommended the Board of Supervisors:

- a. Authorize the Chief Executive Officer for Natividad Medical Center (NMC) or his designee to execute the non-standard agreement with a State and Local Agency Server and Cloud Enrollment Agreement with Software House International (SHI), a Microsoft licensing reseller, for Microsoft Office 365 government services, data backup software, subscriptions, and associated maintenance/support, for the period of September 1, 2021 through August 31, 2024, for an amount not to exceed \$2,693,035; and
- b. Accept non-standard contract provisions as recommended by the Chief Executive Officer for NMC; and
- c. Authorize the Chief Executive Officer for NMC to sign order confirmations on an as-needed basis pursuant this Agreement over the period of September 1, 2021 through August 31, 2024.

SUMMARY/DISCUSSION:

Natividad Medical Center (NMC) relies on Microsoft software and online services to operate its computers, servers, IT applications, and other digital capabilities. This encompasses Microsoft Windows (computers and servers), Microsoft Office Suite (word processing, spreadsheets and presentations), Microsoft Exchange (email), SQL Server (databases), Microsoft SharePoint Online (collaboration) and remote access, amongst others. Over the last decade, NMC has made significant investments in these product licenses. Maintaining our agreements with Microsoft are essential to preserving our software investments and supporting hospital computing operations. Approval to execute both enrollment agreements will allow NMC to maintain licensing and online services for 1968 workforce members (staff, contractors).

NMC, in consultation with Gartner Research, sought the most aggressive pricing our three-year renewal. The County of Riverside (CA) has negotiated an agreement with Microsoft that over 600 State and local agencies are currently leveraging. It entitles NMC to join the lowest cost tier (D) typically reserved for large organizations with an additional discount averaging 7%. It ranks as one ofthe most favorably discounted Microsoft agreement in the U.S.

Microsoft licenses are commonly purchased through an authorized reseller, not through Microsoft directly. At this time NMC seeks to procure the licenses associated with both Microsoft Enrollment agreements through the reseller Software House International (SHI). This request includes that authorization along with the quotes to cover the costs which are based on current counts of licenses inuse.

Per the terms and conditions within the agreements, Natividad is allowed to install additional product licenses, including cloud (online) licenses, for new users as they come on board, but is required to perform an annual "True-Up" to identify the number of licenses actually in use at the end of each year and to pay any difference which may have been incurred for that year. This capability is in the best interest of the County as it mitigates the potential of over purchasing costly licenses up front. The cost of the annual True-Up is variable and based on the type and quantity of licensing and services consumed but the amount requested for future True-ups is based on past costs for True-ups.

Due to the annual fluctuation of the number of Natividad employees, it is recommended that the Chief Information Officer for NMC have the authority to increase the number of licenses and storage capacity, as-needed, over the term of the agreement to accommodate any staff increases that may occur.

OTHER AGENCY INVOLVEMENT:

The Office of County Counsel reviewed and approved this Enterprise Agreement as to form, and the Auditor-Controller reviewed and approved as to payment provisions. The Enterprise Agreement was reviewed and approved by NMC's Finance Committee and by its Board of Trustees on July 9, 2021.

FINANCING:

The total cost for procuring Microsoft licenses for use over a three year period is currently projected at \$2,693,035, of which \$718,143 has been included in the Fiscal Year 2021-22 Adopted Budget. Amounts for remaining years of the Agreement will be included in those budgets as appropriate.

BOARD OF SUPERVISORS STRATEGIC INITIATIVES:

This payment facilitates the maintenance and support of NMC's Microsoft systems and applications that support NMC's patient care systems and hospital computing operations.

SUMMARY/DISCUSSION:

Natividad Medical Center provides food and nutritional services to patients, visitors, and employees as part of its daily operations. CBORD's electronic system Foodservice Suite (FSS) improves service delivery efficiency, patient safety and meal satisfaction as well as assists with compliance with the Joint Commission (TJC) and the Centers for Medicare and Medicaid Services (CMS) food services standards.

The CBORD software provides automation to the process of patient meal service, reporting, and analysis. This includes interfacing with the Meditech system, improved diet order accuracy, production standards, and reduced waste. CBORD supports NMC's future goal of expanding meal services to the room service model where patients can order meals from their bedside.

NMC is requesting approval to amend the existing agreement to extend service and maintenance for an additional one year period to allow for services to continue. This amendment also increases the number of user licenses from 5 to 10.

OTHER AGENCY INVOLVEMENT:

The Office of County Counsel reviewed and approved this amendment No. 4 as to form, and the Auditor-Controller reviewed and approved as to payment provisions. The amendment No. 4 was reviewed and approved by NMC's Finance Committee and by its Board of Trustees on July 9, 2021.

FINANCING:

The cost for this amendment No. 4 is \$31,485 which is included in the Fiscal Year 2021-22 Adopted Budget.

BOARD OF SUPERVISORS STRATEGIC INITIATIVES:

This agreement is for a software system that will improve food and nutrition services for NMC patients. This will directly contribute to a more efficient and effective use of resources within NMC.

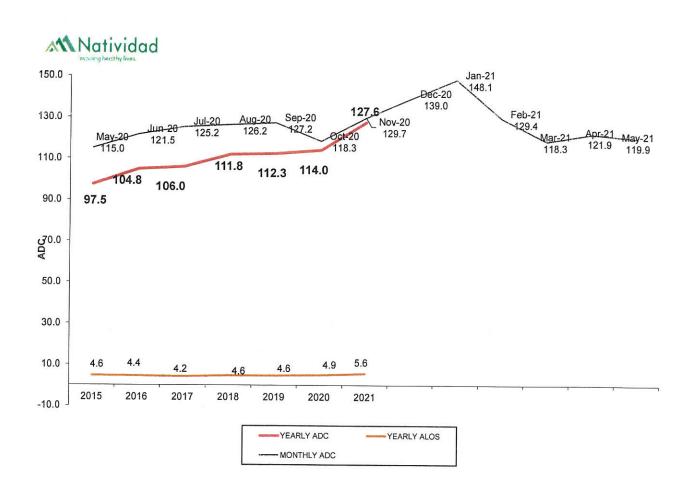

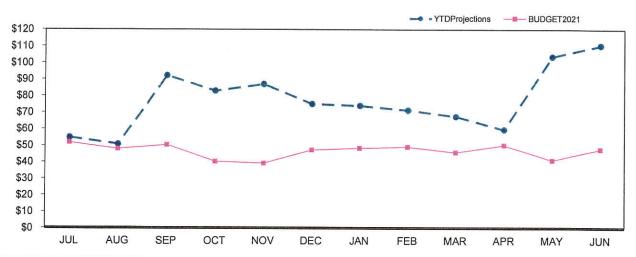
