RECOMMENDATION:

It is recommended the Board of Supervisors:

a. Authorize the Interim Chief Executive Officer for Natividad Medical Center (NMC) or his designee to execute amendment No. 4 to the Agreement (A-13417) with QVentus (formerly known as AnalyticsMD, Inc.) for operational decision support software services, extending the agreement an additional two (2) year period (October 29, 2021 through October 28, 2023), for a revised full agreement term of October 29, 2015 through October 28, 2023, and adding \$210,000 for a revised total agreement amount not to exceed \$781,000.

SUMMARY/DISCUSSION:

Qventus (formerly AnalyticsMD) is an operational decision support software system used by Natividad Medical Center's Emergency Department (ED) and inpatient units that has been implemented to improve department efficiency and productivity. The software utilizes real time patient flow data, such as registration data, staffing ratios, door to physician times, etc. to improve operational performance. This product provides real time reporting, as well as, predictive analytics tools. Through dashboards, alerts, and daily/weekly summaries of data, hospital management and administration teams can identify trends and look for the root causes of inefficiencies. Front line staff use the real time dashboards to monitor patient flow and are prompted to focus on problem areas to prevent bottlenecks. The tool also possesses predictive analytics functionality. Based on the real time dashboards, future trends in patient census are predicted which can automatically trigger alerts and notifications to front line staff to facilitate operational decisions that can alleviate staffing and patient discharge and admission bottlenecks.

NMC is requesting to amend the current Agreement to extend the term for two additional years to cover ongoing operational software subscription and maintenance fees.

OTHER AGENCY INVOLVEMENT:

The Office of County Counsel has reviewed and approved this amendment No. 4 as to form, and the Auditor-Controller has reviewed and approved as to payment provisions. This amendment No. 4 has also been reviewed and approved by NMC's Finance Committee and by its Board of Trustees on August 13, 2021.

FINANCING:

The cost for amendment No. 4 is \$210,000 of which \$105,000 is included in the Fiscal Year 2021-22 Adopted Budget. Amounts for remaining years of the agreement will be included in those budgets as appropriate.

BOARD OF SUPERVISORS STRATEGIC INITIATIVES:

This agreement facilitates the enhanced operational performance of the Emergency Department. This improves efficiency and accuracy with regards to patient care which equates to improved healthcare and equitable health opportunities at NMC.

SUMMARY/DISCUSSION:

Endotool is a clinical decision support software that provides personalized recommendations for insulin therapy to better control the patient's glycemic rates in a more automated fashion. Instead of the provider choosing from multiple order sets, it gives the provider the ability to order Endotool management and the nurse follows the instructions from Endotool rather than hand calculating insulin dosage. The software is built using NMC's policies, procedures and protocols that define insulin management and glycemic control. The system is HIPAA compliant and integrates with Meditech. This product has been shown to decrease the time it takes to have a patient's glucose level under control, reduces the number of hyper- and hypoglycemic events and improves patient outcomes and care.

NMC is requesting an extension of the current agreement for an additional forty (40) month period.

OTHER AGENCY INVOLVEMENT:

The Office of County Counsel has reviewed and approved this amendment No. 1 as to form, and the Auditor-Controller has reviewed and approved as to payment provisions. The amendment No. 1 has also been reviewed and approved by NMC's Finance Committee and by its Board of Trustees on August 13, 2021.

FINANCING:

The cost for this amendment No. 1 is \$87,026 of which \$28,436 is included in the Fiscal Year 2021/22 Adopted Budget. Amounts for remaining years of the agreement will be included in those budgets as appropriate.

RECOMMENDATION:

It is recommended the Board of Supervisors:

a. Authorize the Interim Chief Executive Officer for Natividad or his designee to execute an Agreement with Lucile Salter Packard Children's Hospital at Stanford (LPCH) for Maternal Fetal Medicine Services at Natividad for an amount not to exceed \$348,480 for the period September 1, 2021 through August 31, 2023; and

b. Authorize the Interim Chief Executive Officer for Natividad or his designee to execute up to three (3) future amendments to the agreement which do not significantly alter the scope of work and do not cause an increase of more than ten percent (10%) of the original cost of the agreement per each amendment.

SUMMARY/DISCUSSION:

Natividad offers comprehensive maternal care services including antepartum, intrapartum and postpartum care to women in Monterey County. American College of Obstetricians and Gynecologist recommends Level III maternal centers to have board certified maternal fetal medicine (MFM) physician be available for consultation and management of highly complex, critically ill, or unstable maternal patients.

Natividad would like to enter into an agreement LPCH to provide the MFM services. LPCH will also provide administrative services including clinical education and review of policies and procedures related to MFM. Natividad has obtained an independent opinion of fair market value supporting the payment terms of this Agreement.

OTHER AGENCY INVOLVEMENT:

County Counsel has reviewed and approved this Agreement as to legal form, and the Auditor-Controller has reviewed and approved as to payment provisions. The Agreement has also been reviewed and approved by Natividad's Finance Committee and Board of Trustees.

FINANCING:

The cost for this Agreement is \$348,480 of which \$174,240 is included in the Fiscal Year 2021/2022 Adopted Budget. Amounts for remaining years of the Agreement will be included in those budgets as appropriate. There is no impact to the General Fund.

RECOMMENDATION:

It is recommended that the Board of Supervisors:

a. Authorize the Interim Chief Executive Officer for Natividad or his designee to execute the First Amendment to the Professional and Call Coverage Services Agreement with Seunggu Jude Han, M.D. to provide neurosurgery services at Natividad adding \$340,000 for a revised not to exceed amount of \$1,040,000 and extending the term by twelve months (September 1, 2021 to August 31, 2022) for a revised full term of September 1, 2020 to August 31, 2022. b. Authorize the Interim Chief Executive Officer for Natividad or his designee to sign up to three (3) future amendments to this agreement where the total amendments do not significantly change the scope of work and do not cause an increase of more than ten percent 10% (\$70,000) of the

original contract amount.

SUMMARY/DISCUSSION:

Natividad received its designation as the Level II Trauma Center for Monterey County in January 2015. The American College of Surgeons requires neurosurgeons provide dedicated call coverage with a 30 minute response time for Level II Trauma Centers. In order to provide 24/7 care, it is necessary to develop and sustain a core team of quality neurosurgeons made up of independent contract physicians to provide daily call coverage in the Emergency Department and follow-up care to patients in the Intensive Care Unit and Specialty Clinic.

Natividad would like to amend the agreement with Seunggu Jude Han, M.D., a board certified neurosurgeon, so that he can continue to provide neurosurgical services as part of the comprehensive trauma services required for the Level II Trauma Center. Dr. Han will provide inpatient and outpatient services, procedures in the operating room, primary and backup call coverage in the emergency department as well medical director services for the neurosurgery department. Natividad has obtained an independent opinion of fair market value supporting the payment terms of this Agreement.

OTHER AGENCY INVOLVEMENT:

County Counsel has reviewed and approved this Agreement as to legal form. Auditor-Controller has reviewed and approved this Agreement as to fiscal provisions. The Agreement has also been reviewed and approved by Natividad's Finance Committee and Board of Trustees.

FINANCING:

The cost of this Amendment is \$340,000. The total not to exceed amount of this Agreement is \$1,040,000. The actual cost is contingent upon Dr. Han's participation in the call panel which may fluctuate based on his availability. Natividad has agreements with multiple providers to ensure sufficient coverage of the neurosurgery services where the total expenditure will not exceed \$1,300,000 annually which is included in Fiscal Year 2021/2022 adopted budget. The remaining balance will be budgeted in subsequent fiscal years. There is no impact to the General Fund.

BOARD OF SUPERVISORS STRATEGIC INITIATIVES:

The services rendered in this agreement are required for a Level II Trauma Center and provide Natividad with the additional support it needs in order to provide reliable and high quality patient care which improves the health and quality of life for patients and their families.

As a practical matter, in the United States, Internet identifiers such as blocks of Internet addresses are only available from ARIN.

The proposed agreement is non-standard for the County, but is based upon a standard agreement that ARIN uses throughout the United States and Canada, including with other governmental bodies. The Interim Chief Executive Officer for NMC is recommending approval of this agreement.

OTHER AGENCY INVOLVEMENT:

The Office of County Counsel reviewed this Agreement as to form but has declined to approve, and the Auditor-Controller reviewed and approved as to payment provisions. The Agreement was reviewed and approved by NMC's Finance Committee and by its Board of Trustees on August 13,

FINANCING:

The cost for this agreement is \$1,000 of which \$700 is included in the Fiscal Year 2021-22 Adopted Budget. Amounts for remaining years of the agreement will be included in those budgets as appropriate.

SUMMARY/DISCUSSION:

Healthcare Coding and Consulting Services (HCCS) provides remote coding support, utilizing International Classification of Diseases Tenth Revision (ICD10-CM/PCS), Current Procedural Terminology (CPT), Evaluation /Management Levels (E/M), HCPCs Medical Supply conventions to Natividad designated medical encounters and Education and Training to Natividad as changes occur within the coding spectrum.

HCCS require their coding staff to possess coding credentials. The coders must also maintain their credentials annually, by attending education and training for their specific coding discipline.

Natividad began utilizing HCCS coding support for the Emergency Department in Sept 2016. This vendor was chosen due to the complexity and distinctiveness of our Emergency and Trauma encounters, which are comprise of multiple layers of treatment management, equipment, procedures and extensive documentation. HCCS appends the medical charges to the Emergency and Labor Delivery Emergency Department accounts, which allows the supportive nursing staff to provide care to the patients. HCCS provides coding support for our inpatient encounters to ensure accuracy and timely reimbursement.

HCCS has layers of auditors to review complicated encounters; conduct monthly audits of the coding staff assigned to Natividad account, which meets the compliance requirement. The results are distributed, reviewed, discussed, recommendations to enhance beneficial outcomes for the organization are considered and often executed. HCCS also provides auditing and validation summary documentation of specific third-party payor accounts required service justification.

Natividad recognized with the increased volume of emergency/labor delivery emergency, trauma encounters and inpatient, the level of complexity with accurate coding these services; our existing coding staff are not capable of meeting the managements' level of expectations and demand.

As HCCS adheres to Natividad's mandated completion turnaround times, accuracy, compliance requirements and standards, it is critical and favorable for Natividad to retain HCCS as their coding support vendor.

OTHER AGENCY INVOLVEMENT:

County Counsel has reviewed and approved this amendment as to legal form, and the Auditor-Controller has reviewed and approved as to payment provisions. The renewal & amendment No. 3 has also been reviewed and approved by Natividad's Finance Committee and by its Board of Trustees on August 13, 2021.

FINANCING:

The cost for this renewal & amendment No. 3 is \$450,000 of which \$450,000 is included in the Fiscal Year 2021-22 Adopted Budget.

BOARD OF SUPERVISORS STRATEGIC INITIATIVES:

The services rendered in this agreement provides Natividad with the additional support which is needed due to the credential requirements to ensure accurate appending coding for reimbursement, regulatory, patient care initiatives and data reporting.

Authorize the Deputy Purchasing Agent for Natividad Medical Center (NMC) or his designee to execute renewal and amendment No. 6 to the agreement (A-12753) with RBB Architects Inc. for architectural services for the Radiology Modernization Project at NMC pursuant to the Request for Qualifications (RFQ) # 9600-54, extending the agreement an additional four (4) month period (June 1, 2021 through October 1, 2021) for a revised full agreement term of September 23, 2014 through October 1, 2021.

SUMMARY/DISCUSSION:

NMC is in the construction stage of modernizing the Radiology Department on the first floor of Building 500. The Radiology Department is adding two new Computerized Tomography (CT) scanners, a new Magnetic Resonance Imaging (MRI) as well as creating an Angiography hybrid suite for Interventional Radiology (IR).

The construction was originally forecasted to occur over a 24-month period, with construction occurring into 4 phases to maintain services during the remodel. Construction started on September 4, 2018, and has currently completed 98% of the project. The Office of Statewide Health Planning and Development (OSHPD) requested a fully comprehensive building air balance report in area's that the air handler units in addition to the exhaust fans to verify air exchanges have not been changed this has caused a delay in occupancy. In addition to the air balance report the contractor is finalizing the commissioning of the new equipment and programing the Building Management System (BMS). Lastly during the project, a temporary hot lab, which supports the nuclear medicine procedure room has be verified by the state. State will determine based on a wipe test that there is not radiation hot spots outside of normal limits within the room. This test could take up to six additional weeks. The project has exceed the original project schedule and now is anticipated to be completed by the end of August of 2021. The remaining term of the contract will be billed as-needed through October 31, 2021. The cost for this add service will be \$84,000.

The project may exceed the original forecasted time frame, but NMC believes the project will come in at or below budget.

This Renewal and Amendment No. 6 will include extending the term of the agreement additional four (4) month period (June 1, 2021 through October 1, 2021) for a revised full agreement term of September 23, 2014 through October 1, 2021. A transfer of \$84,000 will be made from the approved capital project.

OTHER AGENCY INVOLVEMENT:

County Counsel has reviewed and approved this renewal and amendment No. 6 as to legal form, and the Auditor-Controller has reviewed and approved as to payment provisions.

FINANCING:

The cost for Renewal and Amendment No. 6 is \$84,000 of which is included in the project contingency. There is no impact to the General Fund.

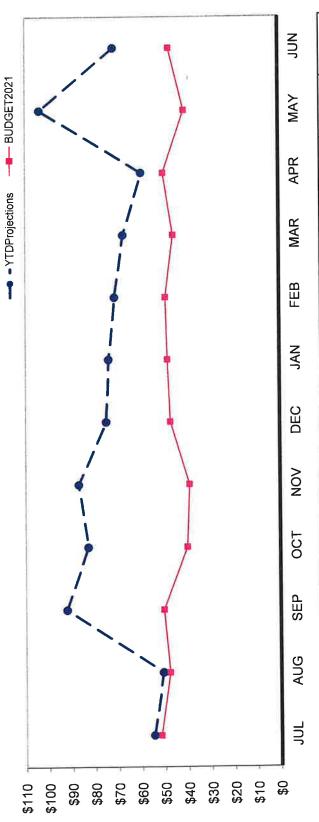
