As a Level II Trauma Center for Monterey County, our CME Program is critical to our verification by the American College of Surgeons. Natividad's CME Program is accredited by the California Medical Association and was awarded Re-accredited with Commendation in 2018 through 2024.

Natividad's CME Program has been accredited since February 2000. During this COVID-19 era, and in support of more focused education to keep our providers with up-to-the-minute information on this emerging disease and its treatments, and to accommodate the restrictions of this pandemic,

Natividad moved its CME Program from in-person activities to a new platform: Internet-based Podcast and Videocast (enduring) activities – accessible on campus and off. This transition allows our providers to access vital new medical information specific to Natividad's needs, from renowned faculty anytime/anywhere.

SUMMARY

The Pharmacy Department is located on the first floor of building 580. The department develops intravenous (IV) medications that are introduced directly into the bloodstream, bypassing the anti-infective defenses of the stomach and skin. Contaminated compounding IV medications can result in patient harm due to infections. To prevent contamination, it is necessary that medications are developed by trained staff using proper procedures in facilities designed to prevent contamination. The current IV compounding facility in the Pharmacy department will not meet new governed regulations for IV compounding. The project has updated the department to meet new laws and regulations by providing a new compounding room with a non-hazardous anteroom and a hazardous medication storage room. Construction has completed this initial scope of construction and is pending acceptance from the Board of Pharmacy and the California Department of Public Health (CDPH).

With the onset of COVID-19 resulting in supply chain delays, there is a need to expand the capacity of the Pharmacy Department. Natividad has identified the need to modify the remainder of the Pharmacy space to accommodate two new extra-large freezers, supplies for COVID-19 medications, and vaccines. Natividad would like to expand the scope of its current approved Pharmacy project to allow for these much needed changes to occur. In order to complete this renovation, the Pharmacy will be temporarily relocated to a secure adjacent hallway. This will allow the contractor to consolidate construction scope into minimal phases. Expanding the additional scope will cost \$705,411 to the approved amount of \$1,200,000 for a new total project cost of \$1,905,411.

OTHER AGENCY INVOLVEMENT:

County Counsel has reviewed and approved this project as to legal form and risk provisions. The Auditor-Controller has reviewed and approved this project as to fiscal provisions.

The CALSTAR Air Medical Services, LLC ("CALSTAR") patient transfer coordination and facilitation services involves coordinating and recording all incoming and outgoing emergency requests for patient consult or transfer. These requests are typically initiated by physicians in circumstances where patients need transfer to the appropriate level of care (either into or out of NMC). When a treating physician deems that there is a medical necessity for a patient to receive care not available at the sending facility, then that patient is transferred to a higher level of care.

This service is crucial for Natividad as it provides a single point of contact (telephone exchange) for both physicians calling into NMC to transfer a patient to us as well as NMC physicians calling out to find an appropriate destination that has the staffing and expertise to receive a patient who needs a service that NMC cannot provide. The coordination and recording of multiple calls that need to occur in rapid fashion to safe life and limb is a specialized and technical medical service.

OTHER AGENCY INVOLVEMENT:

County Counsel has reviewed and approved this amendment No. 4 as to legal form and risk provisions, and the Auditor-Controller has reviewed and approved as to payment provisions. The agreement has also been reviewed and approved by NMC's Finance Committee and by its Board of Trustees on February 11, 2022.

FINANCING:

The cost for this amendment No. 4 is \$275,000, of which \$150,000 is included in the Fiscal Year 2021-22 Adopted Budget. Amounts for remaining years of the agreement will be included in those budgets as appropriate.

BOARD OF SUPERVISORS STRATEGIC INITIATIVES:

The CALSTAR transfer service provides all incoming and outgoing requests for patient consult or transfer; place patients with an admitting physician and consulting physician; verify bed availability; and coordinate transport. The service adheres to the physician's declaration of medical necessity to ensure proper levels of care and patient placement are met, whether inbound to NMC or outbound to an appropriate receiving facility.

Natividad utilizes temporary staffing agencies to staff hard to fill positions in order to meet the hospitals staffing needs to ensure high quality patient care. F1 is able to provide Natividad with clinical, IT, HR and finance staff.

Over the past two years, the need for additional staff has increased due to the COVID-19 pandemic, which increased Natividad's daily census significantly resulting in a consistent need for additional staff.

OTHER AGENCY INVOLVEMENT:

The Office of County Counsel has reviewed and approved this agreement as to form, and the Auditor-Controller has reviewed and approved as to payment provisions. The agreement has also been reviewed and approved by NMC's Finance Committee and by its Board of Trustees on February 11, 2022.

SUMMARY/DISCUSSION:

Natividad received its designation as the Level II Trauma Center for Monterey County in January 2015. The American College of Surgeons, Resources for Optimal Care of the Injured Patient, requires neurosurgical care to be promptly available for the acute care of the brain injured and spinal cord injured patient and neurosurgeons be able to respond for an in-person evaluation within 30 minutes for Level II Trauma Centers. In order to provide this level of 24/7 care, it is necessary to develop and sustain a core team of quality neurosurgeons to provide daily call coverage in the Emergency Department and follow-up care to patients in the Intensive Care Unit and Specialty Clinic.

Natividad would like to enter into this agreement with Pacific Coast Neurosurgical Institute, Inc., for which board certified neurosurgeons will provide neurosurgical services as part of the comprehensive trauma services required for Level II Trauma Centers. The group will provide dedicated primary and backup call coverage in the emergency department, inpatient and outpatient services, procedures in the operating room, as well a medical director for oversight and management of the neurosurgery services. Natividad has obtained an independent opinion of fair market value supporting the payment terms of this Agreement.

OTHER AGENCY INVOLVEMENT:

County Counsel has reviewed and approved this Agreement as to legal form. Auditor-Controller has reviewed and approved this Agreement as to fiscal provisions. The Agreement has also been reviewed and approved by Natividad's Finance Committee and Board of Trustees.

FINANCING:

The total cost of this Agreement is \$6,000,000. \$2,000,000 is included in the Fiscal Year 2021/2022 Adopted Budget. The remaining balance will be budgeted in subsequent fiscal years. There is no impact to the General Fund.

BOARD OF SUPERVISORS STRATEGIC INITIATIVES:

The services rendered in this agreement are required for a Level II Trauma Center and provide Natividad with the additional support it needs in order to provide reliable and high quality patient care which improves the health and quality of life for patients and their families.

SUMMARY/DISCUSSION:

On September 15, 2015 the Monterey County Board of Supervisors approved a Master Agreement with CareFusion Solutions, LLC (Carefusion) associated with the leasing of automated supply dispensing machines for both medical supplies and medications. These supply stations are known as Pyxis stations and Pyxis med-stations, and they enable NMC to ensure that medical supplies are available to immediately dispense medical supplies and medications as needed. The dispensing machines also ensure the capturing and recording of revenues for supplies used by the patients and assist in managing the inventory of supplies. They are an integral part of regulatory compliance. The machines are located throughout patient floors and physicians clinics.

The Customer Order included today is for a refreshed fleet of Pyxis med-stations. The previous fleet included a 60 month lease which has now expired. Due to the advancing age of the current med-stations hardware the existing units are likely more prone to breakdown. Refreshed hardware will ensure reliable access to emergency medications, minimize workflow interruption, as well as secure access to future software upgrades. This customer order is associated with some modifications to the support terms that were stated within the original Master Agreement, all of which are identified in amendment No. 2.

OTHER AGENCY INVOLVEMENT:

The Office of County Counsel has reviewed and approved this Customer Order and associated

amendment No. 2 as to form, and the Auditor-Controller has reviewed and approved as to payment provisions. The customer order and associated amendment No. 2 has also been reviewed and approved by NMC's Finance Committee and by its Board of Trustees on February 11, 2022.

FINANCING:

SUMMARY/DISCUSSION:

NMC desires to extend the term for use of Net Health Systems, Inc.'s rehabilitation documentation software (ReDoc). NMC's outpatient Physical Therapy, Occupational Therapy and Speech Therapy Departments currently uses the ReDoc software in conjunction with the hospital's Meditech system for scheduling and billing. ReDoc was implemented this past year to replace the paper charting system that the Physical Therapy department was using. Meditech does not offer an outpatient solution for Therapy medical record documentation. Net Health is a nationally recognized company that provides rehabilitation documentation software solutions to more than 500 outpatient therapy sites and is considered an industry leader for outpatient therapy online documentation.

Net Health's enterprise solution provides therapists and therapy teams the tools they need to operate efficiently, stay compliant, and enhance patient care and outcomes. Outpatient Therapy is strictly regulated by regulatory agencies, and the ReDoc software keeps current with changes in regulations and billing requirements. Patient care is also enhanced by using ReDoc, as the software allows the therapist to generate comprehensive reports that convey medical necessity and functional outcomes to send to the patient's provider. Additional benefits of using ReDoc, is the software's ability to alert the therapist to any billing or coding errors and provides reminders for critical events, such as progress reports, re-certifications, and re-authorizations, all while tracking Medicare Cap limits. The ReDoc software also provides appointment scheduling, patient reminders, robust analytics, billing, and management reports. ReDoc also provides point-of-care alerts to the therapist related to therapy caps, re-authorization requirements, and other critical events during the patient's therapy.

Natividad also utilizes the ReDoc Home Exercise Program and Focus on Therapeutic Outcomes (FOTO) modules. The Home Exercise Program module improves patient engagement with easy online personalized home exercise plans. FOTO is a predictive analytics outcomes management system that captures and reports nationally benchmarked, risk-adjusted comparisons based on data collected from more than 7 million completed patient episodes. FOTO's patient-reported outcomes

compare treatment effectiveness, efficiency and satisfaction in real time to improve patient care and facilitate clinician growth.

In addition, Natividad utilizes Net Health's AgilityEH software package for the purpose of recording and tracking services that are provided to employees by the Employee Health Department. This software allows Natividad to better monitor and report services rendered, such as TB Screening, Respiratory Fit Testing, Exposure Management and Vaccination Administration in order to meet regulatory requirements for employee health services.

Natividad has purchased three tool sets from Net Health: ReDoc Outpatient, ReDoc Inpatient, and Agility. ReDoc Inpatient currently has a termination date of June 30, 2024. This amendment extends the licensing for ReDoc Outpatient and Agility to be coterminous with ReDoc Inpatient.

The Office of County Counsel has reviewed and approved this amendment No. 7 as to form, and the Auditor-Controller has reviewed and approved as to payment provisions. Authorize the Deputy Purchasing Agent for Natividad Medical Center (NMC) or his designee to execute amendment No. 3 to the agreement with Renovo Solutions LLC (A-14229) per Request for Proposals (RFP) 9600-70 for preventative maintenance plus repairs on biomedical equipment, increasing the total agreement amount by an additional \$2,404,085 for a revised total agreement amount not to exceed \$5,677,369, and extending the term of the Agreement for an additional two (2) year period with a revised term of March 1, 2019 through February 28, 2024.

SUMMARY/DISCUSSION:

In 2018 Natividad issued a Request for Proposals (RFP) #9600-70 for preventative maintenance plus repairs on biomedical equipment at the hospital. Four bids were received and after a detailed analysis and selection process Renovo Solutions was awarded the agreement which the Board of Supervisors approved on February 12, 2019. A flat fee structure was set based on inventory levels at the time the RFP was released.

The Board approved Amendment No. 1 to this Agreement in June of 2020 at which time diagnostic imaging (DI) equipment was added to the service contract with Renovo for maintenance and repair in addition to the biomedical equipment, with an associated \$752,284 increase associated with an inventory true-up and newly added DI services, plus unplanned services billed as time & materials. The Board also approved Amendment No. 2 in which an increase of \$921,000 was approved solely to cover unplanned services billed as time and materials which accumulated due to increased service needs associated with Covid, an increase in equipment inventory, and equipment falling off warranty.

Natividad negotiated a new pricing structure with Renovo so as to minimize unplanned costs that are billed as time and materials. The inventory was updated and most of the inventory is now moving to full coverage status. This in and of itself reduces time and materials costs for equipment that may have had minimal coverage previous (such as maintenance only, but not repair). Natividad also requested that Renovo assume some level of risk by agreeing to cover the first \$25,000 of time and materials costs that accumulate annually. By adjusting the inventory service levels to full coverage, and with the first \$25,000 of time and materials costs annually covered by Renovo, Natividad believes there will be a significant reduction in the amount of unplanned costs billed as time and materials.

At this time Natividad is requesting approval to accept the new pricing structure and also to extend the term of the Agreement for an additional two (2) year period.

OTHER AGENCY INVOLVEMENT:

County Counsel has reviewed and approved this amendment No. 3 as to legal form, and the Auditor-Controller has reviewed and approved as to payment provisions. The amendment No. 3 has also been reviewed and approved by NMC's Finance Committee and by its Board of Trustees on February 11, 2022.

FINANCING:

The cost for this amendment is \$3,627,540, of which \$393,544 is included in the Fiscal Year 2021-22 Adopted Budget. Future costs will be included in those budgets as appropriate.




