SUMMARY/DISCUSSION:

Natividad Medical Center utilizes the registry services provided by Focus One Solutions, LLC to staff hard to fill clinical positions in order to meet the hospitals staffing needs to ensure high quality patient care. Focus One Solutions provides Natividad Medical Center a one-stop search agency for nurses and clinical technicians. Focus One has a network of over three dozen independent agencies that provide the needed personnel. Natividad Medical Center uses the registry services to fill positions in the following areas: Emergency department, Intensive Care, Labor and Delivery, Surgery, Neonatal Intensive Care, Behavioral department, Rehabilitation, Physical and Occupational therapy, Radiology, Ultrasound, Interventional Radiology, Clinical Lab and Pharmacy.

Over the past year, the need for additional clinical staff has increased due to the ramifications of the COVID-19 pandemic on the availability of qualified applicants. In addition, Natividad Medical Center has seen a larger number of resignations and a smaller applicant pool. As a result, additional nurses and other clinical continue to be needed in order to provide high quality care to our community.

Health Care Interpreter Network's automated video/voice call center system provides Natividad Medical Center with 24/7 access to Qualified healthcare interpreters in 170 languages, including American Sign Language (ASL) using video conferencing devices and various forms of telephone interpreter services.

Natividad Medical Center has been using Health Care Interpreter Network's network to stay compliant with the ever-changing rules and regulations to comply with CMS requirements as well as maintaining Joint Commission accreditation. The provision of interpretation services also helps Natividad Medical Center to improve the quality of healthcare and reduce liability for medical errors due to a breakdown in communication.

Natividad Medical Center utilizes two outside contractors, per RFP 9600-64 to collect on Natividad Medical Center's self-pay patients and bad debt collections. The contractor shall receive three (3) daily data files of all self-pay patients from Natividad Medical Center's Meditech system. With this information, the contractors will be responsible to send three (3) collection notices to the patient within a 150-day time-frame requesting payment. The contractors are responsible for arranging and setting up a payment plan for services incurred at Natividad Medical Center. If there is no response, the patients account is put into a bad debt collection for further collection efforts. Liens are applied as appropriate.

Payment is based on the amount of debt collected and is, therefore, an unknown, so the agreement documents themselves do not state a total agreement amount specifically. Natividad Medical Center is requesting an increased aggregate dollar limit for both agreements not to exceed \$10,270,000 which reflects an estimated amount Natividad Medical Center might pay for debt collection fees through the end of the term September 30, 2025.

NMC owns multiple Caterpillar Diesel Emergency Generators and maintain reliability by doing routine preventative maintenance and testing. Quinn Power Systems has the ability to provide emergency generator and automatic transfer switch preventive maintenance and testing services for NMC.

The Life Safety Code requires the hospital to provide reliable emergency electrical power to alarm systems, exit route and exit sign illumination, emergency communication systems, elevators, equipment that could cause patient harm when it fails, including life support systems, blood, bone, and tissue storage systems, medical air compressors, medical and surgical vacuum systems, and areas in which loss of power could result in patient harm, including operating rooms, recovery rooms, obstetrical delivery rooms, nurseries, and urgent care areas. Maintaining the reliability of the emergency electrical system requires periodic preventive maintenance to be performed. In addition, the Joint Commission requires that monthly emergency generator tests are conducted with a dynamic load that is at least 30% of the nameplate rating of the generator or meets the manufacturer's recommended prime movers' exhaust gas temperature. If the hospital does not meet either the 30% of nameplate rating or the recommended exhaust gas temperature during any of the monthly tests then they must test each emergency generator once every 12 months using supplemental (dynamic or static) loads of: 25% of nameplate rating for 30 minutes, followed by 50% of nameplate rating for 30 minutes, followed by 75% of nameplate rating for 60 minutes, for a total of 2 continuous hours.

At least once every 12 months, hospitals must test each emergency generator under dynamic or static load that is at least 30% of the nameplate rating of the generator or meets the manufacturers recommended prime movers' exhaust gas temperature for a minimum of 4 continuous hours.

be maintained in operating condition to provide automatic restoration of power for emergency circuits within ten seconds after normal power failure. RECOMMENDATION:

It is recommended the Board of Supervisors:

- a. Authorize the Chief Executive Officer for Natividad Medical Center (NMC) or his designee to execute an agreement with GE Healthcare for MUSE cardiology system software at NMC for an amount not to exceed \$114,288 with an agreement term September 1, 2023 through August 31, 2026.
- b. Approve the NMC's Chief Executive Officer's recommendation to accept non-standard indemnification, insurance, and liability provisions within the agreement.

SUMMARY/DISCUSSION:

The MUSE Cardiology Information System is a software system that promotes rapid diagnosis via electronic Electrocardiograms (ECG's) via a treadmill, allowing Cardiologists to review current and historical data, read the ECG, and assist fellow clinicians in making faster decisions for patients. An electrocardiography (ECG or EKG) test is the process of recording the electrical activity of the heart over a period of time.

On May 18, 2018, the Monterey County Board of Supervisors approved a quotation and addendum with GE Healthcare which constituted a support agreement for the MUSE Cardiology software in use at NMC. That agreement expired in May of 2023. This is a new agreement to allow for continued use plus support of the MUSE cardiology software system at NMC.

OTHER AGENCY INVOLVEMENT:

The Office of County Counsel has reviewed and approved this agreement, and the Auditor-Controller has reviewed and approved as to payment provisions. This agreement has also been reviewed and approved by NMC's Finance Committee and by its Board of Trustees on August 11, 2023.

FINANCING:

The cost for this agreement is \$114,288, of which \$38,096 is included in the Fiscal Year 2023-24 Adopted Budget.

BOARD OF SUPERVISORS STRATEGIC INITIATIVES:

This agreement allows for continued use of the MUSE cardiology system at NMC and includes maintenance and support for the software. It is a requirement that medical equipment used in patient care, such as the MUSE cardiology system, be regularly maintained for optimum and reliable performance, thereby contributing to quality patient care.

SUMMARY/DISCUSSION:

NMC offers comprehensive maternal care services including antepartum, intrapartum and postpartum care to women in Monterey County. To help reduce maternal mortality and morbidity, the American College of Obstetricians and Gynecologist established maternal levels of care and recommends Level III maternal centers have board certified maternal fetal medicine (MFM) physicians available for consultation and management of highly complex, critically ill, or unstable maternal patients.

The County operates the Sally P. Archer Child Advocacy Center and Bates-Eldredge Child Sexual Abuse Clinic (CAC) located at NMC in the Barnet J. Segal Outpatient Center where Physicians perform medical-legal examinations to evaluate cases of suspected or actual child abuse to provide documented evidence to assist in the prosecution of criminal cases. NMC must arrange for a qualified medical director for general administration of the day-to-day operations,

development of the services, review of policies and supervision of the ancillary services in the CAC.

NMC would like to amend its agreement with LPCH to provide the same services without interruption. Natividad has obtained an independent opinion of fair market value supporting the payment terms of this Agreement.

OTHER AGENCY INVOLVEMENT:

County Counsel has reviewed and approved this Amendment as to legal form, and the Auditor-Controller has reviewed and approved as to payment provisions. The Amendment has also been reviewed and approved by Natividad's Finance Committee and Board of Trustees.

FINANCING:

The cost for this amendment is \$300,000. The total not to exceed amount of this agreement is \$426,880. \$213,440 is included in the Fiscal Year 2023/2024 Adopted Budget. The remaining amount will be budgeted in subsequent fiscal years. There is no impact to the General Fund.

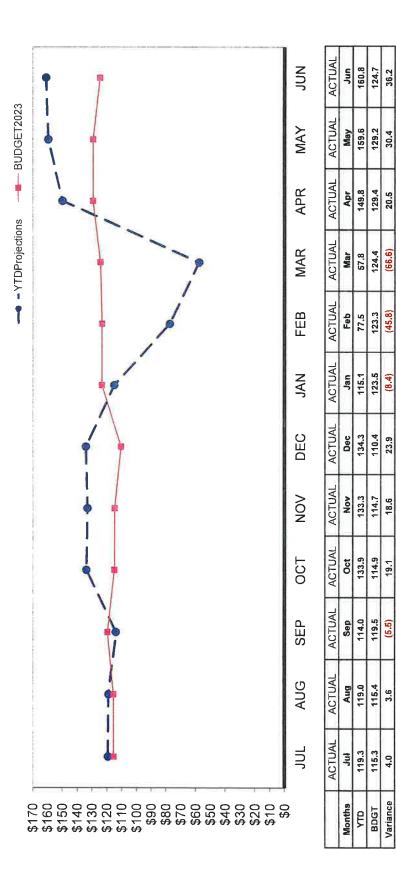
