





#### Family Medicine Residency

- Attracting diverse residents who share our mission.
  - 60% of current residents BIPOC (Black, Indigenous, or People of Color).
  - 40% from groups underrepresented in Medicine (Black, Latinx, Native American).
  - 70% of residents are proficient in Spanish.
- 2023: 8 out of 10 graduates will be practicing locally.
- 32 out of 55 Family Medicine staff physicians completed their residency at NMC.

# **Health Department Alignment**

- July 20, 2022: Board of Supervisors votes to create an integrated health system for Natividad and Monterey County Health Department.
  - Natividad and Monterey County Health Department clinics collaborate through four multi-disciplinary teams to ensure alignment and meet service needs.
  - Improving patient experience and clinical operations:
    - Increased walk-in clinic appointments across Monterey County clinics.
    - Reduced no-show rates.
    - Decreased clinic call wait times.
    - Improved communication for laboratory results between entities.
    - Provided interpreter services.








# **Average Daily Census**


Total Hospital – Annual






## **Emergency Department Visits**


Average Per Month (in Millions)
