a. Authorize the Chief Executive Officer for Natividad Medical Center (NMC) or his designee to execute a Program Letter of Agreement with Katherine Healthcare LLC for Resident rotations at no cost with an agreement term retroactively from February 15, 2025 through February 14, 2030.

b. Approve the NMC's Chief Executive Officer's recommendation to accept non-standard insurance provisions within the agreement.

..Report <u>RECOMMENDATION</u>:

It is recommended the Board of Supervisors:

a. Authorize the Chief Executive Officer for Natividad Medical Center (NMC) or his designee to execute a Program Letter of Agreement with Katherine Healthcare LLC for Resident rotations at no cost with an agreement term retroactively from February 15, 2025 through February 14, 2030.

b. Approve the NMC's Chief Executive Officer's recommendation to accept non-standard insurance provisions within the agreement.

SUMMARY/DISCUSSION:

This agreement is to establish an educational partnership between the Natividad Family Medicine Residency and Katherine Healthcare, a long-term care facility located in Salinas.

The Accreditation Council for Graduate Medical Education (ACGME) requirements for Family Medicine Residency specify the following requirements pertaining to training in long-term care facilities (e.g. skilled nursing facilities or nursing homes):

- Residents must demonstrate competency to diagnose, manage, and integrate the care of patients of all ages in various inpatient settings, including hospitals, **long-term care facilities**, and rehabilitation facilities.
- Residents must be primarily responsible for a panel continuity patients, integrating each patient's care across all settings, including the home, **long-term care facilities**, the FMP site, specialty care facilities, and inpatient care facilities.
- Long-term care experiences should occur over a minimum of 24 months.
- Programs should have family medicine physician faculty members providing care outside of an FMP, including in inpatient pediatric, pregnancy-related care, **skilled nursing**, and home-based care facilities and settings.

The residency does not currently have a relationship with a long-term care facility to provide these training experiences. The leadership and staff of Katherine Healthcare are enthusiastic about incorporating the Family Medicine residents and faculty into their care team, as several of them have worked with our residents and faculty at other facilities.

The residents will provide primary care for a panel of patients at Katherine Healthcare, conducting monthly and as needed visits under the supervision of faculty physicians. Residents can spend

additional time getting to know patients, and provide continuity of care over several years, which his beneficial to the patients. Our service will also be able to provide enhanced inpatient care to patients from our panel of Katherine Healthcare patients when they are hospitalized at Natividad Medical Center, as they will be admitted to our Family Medicine Inpatient Service and cared for by residents and faculty who are familiar with their medical history.

Benefits to Natividad Medical Center include excellent training for residents, compliance with residency accreditation requirements, and revenues from supervising physicians overseeing the resident visits (billing is submitted through Natividad Medical Center).

OTHER AGENCY INVOLVEMENT:

The Office of County Counsel has reviewed and approved this agreement as to legal form, and the Auditor-Controller has reviewed and approved as to payment provisions. The agreement has also been reviewed and approved by NMC's Finance Committee and by its Board of Trustees on June 13, 2025

FINANCING:

There is no cost associated with this agreement.

BOARD OF SUPERVISORS STRATEGIC INITIATIVES:

This educational collaboration improves Natividad's ability to train family physicians prepared to provide comprehensive care to the people of Monterey County, both during their 3 years of residency training, during which they care for patients at Natividad and the Monterey County Clinic Services Bureau, as well as after graduation from residency, as many of our graduates will go on to practice primary care in Monterey County.

It is recommended the Board of Supervisors:

a. Authorize the Chief Executive Officer for Natividad Medical Center (NMC) or his designee to execute an agreement with AE & Associates, LLC for medical billing coding, audits, onsite training, and remote coding support services at NMC, for an amount not to exceed \$250,000, with an agreement term August 1, 2025 through July 31, 2028.

b. Authorize the Chief Executive Officer for Natividad Medical Center or his designee to execute up to three (3) future amendments to the agreement which do not significantly alter the scope of work and do not cause an increase of more than 10% (\$25,000) of the original cost of the agreement, for total contract liability of (\$275,000).

SUMMARY/DISCUSSION:

In addition to the increase with audit reviews to ensure that all regulatory and coding assignments are accurate, NMC has a need for additional services such as Trauma Registry services, Coding Appeals and Education for coders and physicians which requires specialized state knowledge and expertise when appending service codes and documentation.

The service that AE & Associates, LLC provides to NMC ensures that the submission for reimbursement is accurate and the data submission to public entities meets the state standards and requirements. The appending of medical codes is based on the treatment, accurate documentation and services provided to the patient. Patients are able to obtain resources and apply for other services to sustain their daily living.

Lastly, the difficulty with recruitment of qualified licensed coders in the various categories of coding complication, ongoing updates, third party reviews to ensure transparency has made it challenging for NMC.

MealSuite works independently as a full foodservice management system, capable of supporting hospitals, long-term care facilities, and other healthcare institutions. However, in this case, it also functions jointly with another software used by staff at Natividad to facilitate patient-specific services and tray workflows.

For Natividad Medical Center, MealSuite will serve as the system of record for menu planning, therapeutic diets, food production, and inventory. It allows detailed configuration of hospital menus, dietary restrictions, and forecasting tools that enable cost control and food safety.

Benefits include:

In April 9, 2013, the Board of Supervisors approved an agreement between the County of Monterey and The Gordian Group, Inc. to provide administrative services for the Job Order Contracting (JOC) System. Sourcewell (formerly the National Joint Powers Alliance, aka "NJPA") is a public agency operating under the enabling authority outlined in Minnesota Statute 123A.21, which allows participating nationwide government and education agencies ("Members") to reduce the cost of purchasing by leveraging their combined national purchasing power through cooperative efforts. On May 4, 2021, Sourcewell released RFP 050421 for Indefinite Quantity Construction Contracting Systems and Related Services and The Gordian Group (Gordian) responded and was awarded a service contract. Services offered and accepted within Gordian's proposal in response to the Sourcewell RFP include Job Order Contracting (JOC) administrative services.

The County of Monterey is a member of Sourcewell and per the terms of the RFP 050421 which allow all public agencies within the U.S. to procure off of the contract awarded from RFP 071415, NMC is procuring administrative services rendered for Job Order Contracting (JOC) projects from Gordian by piggybacking off the Sourcewell Contract agreement 050421-GGI Other Monterey County departments also currently utilize Gordian's services for JOC projects by piggybacking off the Sourcewell contract as well. NMC is one of the implementers of the County's Job Order Contracting (JOC) program for the County. The County contracts with The Gordian Group, Inc. (Gordian) to provide the JOC system.

The Gordian contract is procured through a cooperative award made by Sourcewell (formally National Joint Powers Association). Natividad Medical Center is requesting to increase the Sourcewell Contract 050421 total spending limit in the amount of \$125,000 for a revised total spending limit not to exceed \$725,000 without needing to change the contract term. To incorporate

the County's standard risk provisions and other relevant terms and conditions into the service obligations, NMC and Gordian executed a new Sourcewell on September 16, 2021 through June 7, 2026 in the amount of \$725,000.

The JOC program currently provided to the County by The Gordian Group, Inc. is referred to as the JOC Complete Solution[®], which includes assistance with developing each job order from identification to job order issuance.

In addition to job order development services, the County has identified the need for The Gordian Group, Inc. to provide the JOC Complete Solution PlusTM option, which includes construction management services to manage job orders from job order issuance to completion of the punch list to job order close-out, construction estimating services, and project budgeting and planning, on a project-by-project basis as requested by the County.

A five percent (5%) License Fee to utilize the JOC Program is payable to The Gordian Group, Inc. only when a Job Order is issued to a JOC Contractor. Optionally, as needed, the County may utilize JOC Project Management services for an additional 5.95% fee. The Gordian Group, Inc. fees are contained in the overall eligible project budgets.

a. Authorize the Chief Executive Officer (CEO) for Natividad Medical Center (NMC) or his designee to execute the Professional and Call Coverage Services Agreement with Mitchell D. Cahn, M.D. to provide vascular surgery services at NMC for an amount not to exceed \$600,000 for the period August 1, 2025 to June 30, 2027; and

b. Authorize the CEO for NMC or his designee to sign up to three (3) future amendments to this Agreement where the total amendments do not significantly change the scope of work, do not exceed 10% (\$60,000) of the original contract amount and increase the total amount above \$660,000.

RECOMMENDATION:

It is recommended that the Board of Supervisors

a. Authorize the Chief Executive Officer (CEO) for Natividad Medical Center (NMC) or his designee to execute the Professional and Call Coverage Services Agreement with Mitchell D. Cahn, M.D. to provide vascular surgery services at NMC for an amount not to exceed \$600,000 for the period August 1, 2025 to June 30, 2027; and

b. Authorize the CEO for NMC or his designee to sign up to three (3) future amendments to this Agreement where the total amendments do not significantly change the scope of work, do not exceed 10% (\$60,000) of the original contract amount and increase the total amount above \$660,000.

SUMMARY/DISCUSSION:

Natividad must arrange for the professional consultation and treatment for patients who present to the emergency department and outpatient clinics in need of medical care or treatment in vascular surgery. Natividad would like to enter into this agreement with Dr. Cahn, a board certified vascular and thoracic surgeon, to provide inpatient and outpatient services, procedures in the operating room, and participate in the vascular surgery call panel for the emergency department. The vascular services provided are part of the comprehensive trauma services required for the Level II Trauma Center and vital to the continued operations of Natividad. NMC has obtained an independent opinion of fair market value supporting the payment terms of this Agreement.

OTHER AGENCY INVOLVEMENT:

County Counsel has reviewed and approved this Agreement as to legal form. Auditor-Controller has reviewed and approved this Agreement as to fiscal provisions. The Agreement has also been reviewed and approved by Natividad Medical Center's Finance Committee and Board of Trustees on June 13, 2025.

FINANCING:

The total not to exceed amount of this agreement is \$600,000. The actual cost is contingent upon Mitchell D. Cahn, M.D.'s, participation in the call panel which may fluctuate based on availability. Natividad has agreements with multiple providers to ensure sufficient coverage of the vascular services where the total expenditure will not exceed \$2,250,696 annually which is included in Fiscal Year 2025/2026 Recommended Budget. The remaining balance will be budgeted in subsequent fiscal years. Funding will be provided from NMC's Enterprise Fund 451-9600-6608.

BOARD OF SUPERVISORS STRATEGIC INITIATIVES:

The services rendered in this agreement are required for a Level II Trauma Center and provide NMC with the additional support it needs in order to provide reliable and high-quality patient care which improves the health and quality of life for patients and their families.

..Report <u>RECOMMENDATION</u>:

It is recommended the Board of Supervisors:

Authorize the Chief Executive Officer for Natividad Medical Center (NMC) or his designee to execute amendment No. 2 to the Agreement (A-16532) with Triage LLC (formerly RTG MSP Medical, LLC dba RTG Medical) for staff procurement management services, extending the agreement an additional one (1) year period (August 1, 2025 through July 31, 2026) for a revised full agreement term of August 1, 2023 through July 31, 2026, and adding \$5,000,000 for a new total agreement amount not-to-exceed \$18,200,000.

SUMMARY/DISCUSSION:

RTG Medical provides essential support by supplying expert agency nurses and clinical technicians through a strong network of over thirty specialized agencies. With their assistance, NMC will effectively staff critical areas such as the Emergency Department, Intensive Care, Intermediate Care, Labor and Delivery, Surgery, Neonatal Intensive Care, Mother-Baby, Psychiatric Care, and Rehabilitation. The registry will also support needs in Physical, Speech, and Occupational Therapy, as well as Radiology, Ultrasound, Interventional Radiology, the Clinical Lab, Dietetics, and Pharmacy.

The demand for additional clinical staff has surged in recent years due to a decreasing pool of qualified applicants. NMC experiences resignations, increasing the urgency to attract skilled nurses and other healthcare professionals committed to providing exceptional care for our community. NMC is requesting to continue to partner with RTG Medical to meet the hospital's staffing needs and maintain the highest standards of care.

NMC is requesting that this amendment be retroactive to August 24, 2024, to align with the date that RTG was acquired by Triage in addition to a need to increase registry rates to attract registry for critical positions within the facility, particularly nurses for the Labor & Delivery Department, which continues to be a challenging position to fill. The new rate ranges on the amended rate sheet will allow additional flexibility to NMC as needed and provide the hospital the ability to fluctuate rates due to supply and demand. In particular there was a urgent need to increase rates for Labor and Delivery due vacancies, leave of absences and union complaints from staff to meet core staffing.

OTHER AGENCY INVOLVEMENT:

The Office of County Counsel has reviewed and approved this amendment No. 2 as to form, and the Auditor-Controller has reviewed and approved as to payment provisions. The amendment No. 2 has 40

also been reviewed and approved by NMC's Finance Committee and by its Board of Trustees on June 13, 2025. **FINANCING:**

The cost for this amendment No. 2 is \$5,000,000 of which \$5,000,000 is included in the FY 2025-26 Recommended Budget. Amounts for remaining years of the agreement will be included in those budgets as appropriate. Funding will be provided from NMC's Enterprise Fund 451-9600-8650.
