#### **SUMMARY:**

It is necessary for the Residency Program to maintain a core team of qualified family medicine physicians made up of employed and independent contractor physicians for patient care and the supervision of its residents.

#### **DISCUSSION**

NMC has an agreement with Dr. Chew to provide family medicine and supervision of resident services for the Residency Program from time to time as needed. NMC wishes to amend the agreement before the term date to add additional funds and to extend the term by 24 months from the date of expiration so that Dr. Chew can continue to provide the same services without interruption. # ..Report RECOMMENDATION:

# It is recommended the Board of Supervisors:

a. Authorize the Chief Executive Officer for Natividad Medical Center (NMC) or his designee to execute a retroactive nonstandard agreement with Philips Healthcare for cardiovascular ultrasound, portable x-ray, and general x-ray maintenance and services at NMC for a maximum County obligation of \$1,361,119 for the term of September 27, 2025 through January 26, 2030. b. Approve the NMC's Chief Executive Officer's recommendation to accept non-standard indemnification, limitations on liability, and limitations on damages provisions within the agreement.

# **SUMMARY:**

The proposed Philips radiology service contract will help ensure Natividad Medical Center keeps its general radiography x-ray and cardiovascular ultrasound machines working well to provide reliable patient care and meet state and federal radiation safety standards. Philips will take care of the equipment by doing regular preventative maintenance inspections, fixing issues, and ensuring everything meets safety and quality requirements.

The Philips service agreement strengthens Natividad Medical Center's ability to keep radiology services operational, meet trauma program verification standards, and deliver consistent care for our community and additionally regular maintenance extends the life of these expensive machines and keeps them working well. This agreement makes sure the hospital's radiology services run smoothly for doctors and patients.

## **DISCUSSION**

Under the contract, Philips will regularly inspect and fine-tune the x-ray and cardiovascular ultrasound machines to prevent breakdowns, fix any problems quickly, and provide replacement parts when needed. They will also update the machine's software to keep it modern and compliant with regulations. Philips offers 24 hours a day 7 days a week phone support and can troubleshoot certain issues remotely.

As an acute care hospital Natividad Medical Center is required to provide radiology services. This contract saves money and ensures safety and compliance of our services. Instead of paying high costs for unexpected repairs, the contract offers fixed, predictable costs and discounted parts. It also includes regular safety checks to meet strict health and safety rules, ensuring the equipment is always safe and produces clear images for accurate diagnoses.

# **OTHER AGENCY INVOLVEMENT:**

The Office of County Counsel has reviewed and approved this agreement to form, and the Auditor-Controller has reviewed and approved as to payment provisions. The agreement has also been reviewed and approved by NMC's Finance Committee and by its Board of Trustees on October 3, 2025.

# **FINANCING:**

The cost for this agreement is \$1,361,119 of which \$237,572 is included in the FY 2025-26 Adopted Budget. Amounts for remaining years of the agreement will be included in those budgets as appropriate. There is no impact on the General Fund with this action.

## **BOARD OF SUPERVISORS STRATEGIC INITIATIVES:**

A professional service contract for radiology equipment is not just a maintenance expense—it is a <u>strategic safeguard</u> for patient safety, operational efficiency, financial predictability, and trauma readiness. It aligns with our hospital's goals of delivering high-quality, uninterrupted care while managing resources responsibly.

The Philips radiology equipment service agreement ensures Natividad Medical Center's x-ray systems remain reliable, safe, and compliant with national standards, directly supporting Monterey County's Strategic Goal of Well-Being and Quality of Life. By reducing equipment downtime and enhancing service reliability, the agreement strengthens access to timely, high-quality diagnostic care. This partnership enhances both the quality of facilities and the delivery of services that promote community health and well-being.

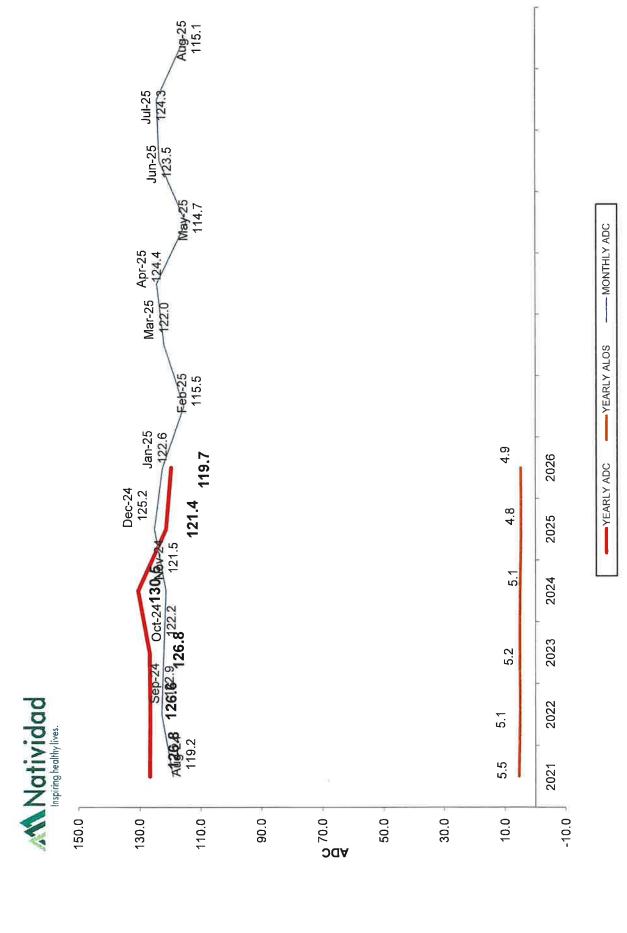

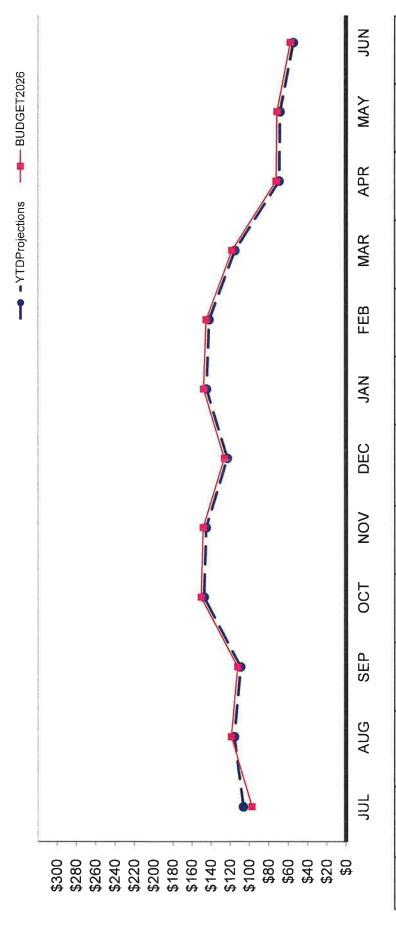
